Adalbert and Catherine Zielinski lived in Gluszyn within the Byton Catholic Parish. Catherine's maiden name has not been determined.

Records during this time period did not always provide a surname. The best candidate record for their marriage took place in 1782. The bride and groom were named Adalbert and Catherine with the wedding listed under Gluszyn. If this is the correct record, it is reasonable to conclude that both were born around 1762, but the location of their births are unknown.

Records show that Adalbert and Catherine Zielinski may have had at least nine children, all born in Strozewo:

Their daughter Margaret Zielinski married Vincent Sawienski in 1815 in Byton. They are Michael E. Byczek's 4x-great-grandparents.

The death records for Adalbert and Catherine Zielinski have not been found.

1782 Marriage for Adalbert and Catherine, without surnames Byton Parish - Listed for Gluszyn


This record is reflective of fact that surnames were not always used in the church ledger books. This is the best candidate for their marriage, but it is not possible to verify without family information.



Additional Information

Adalbert and Catherine Zielinski are Michael E. Byczek's 5x-great-grandparents. Their daughter Margaret Zielinski (4x-great-grandmother) married Vincent Sawienski in 1815 in Byton. Their daughter Sophia Sawienski (3x-great-grandmother) married Frank Januszewski in 1834 in Byton. Their daughter Martha Januszewski (2x-great-grandmother) married Lawrence Bykowski in 1871 in Swierczyn. Their son Joseph Bykowski (great-grandfather) married Margaret Piotrowski in 1907 in Witowo prior to settling in Chicago, IL. Their son Roman Bykowski (grandfather) arrived in the United States when he was three years old. The family lived in the Bucktown neighborhood. Roman married Antoinette Murzynowicz/Marynowski in 1936 at St. Stanislaus Kostka in the Pulaski Park neighborhood. Their daughter Betty A. Bykowski (mother) married Michael M. Byczek in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children, Michael E. Byczek (the eldest) and Katherine S. Byczek, both born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.

- Bytoń is a village in Radziejów County. It is the seat of the gmina called Gmina Bytoń.
- Zgniły Głuszynek is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Topólka, within Radziejów County (Unclear if the same as Gluszyn from the time period. Current maps do show a location Gluszyn near Zgniły Głuszynek, but not with a description).
