Adalbert (Wojciech) Byczek and Catherine (Katarzyna) Czarny were married in 1874 in the Catholic church located in Osobnica in southeastern Poland near Jasło. They were both born in Osobnica on neighboring farms. Adalbert was born in 1846 and Catherine in 1851. The parents of Adalbert Byczek were Jacob (Jakub) Byczek and Catherine (Katarzyna) Dybas from House #118 in Osobnica. Catherine Czarny's parents were Paul (Pawel) Czarny and Marianna Paluch from House #117.

Adalbert Byczek and Catherine Czarny had nine known children, all born at House #118 in Osobnica:

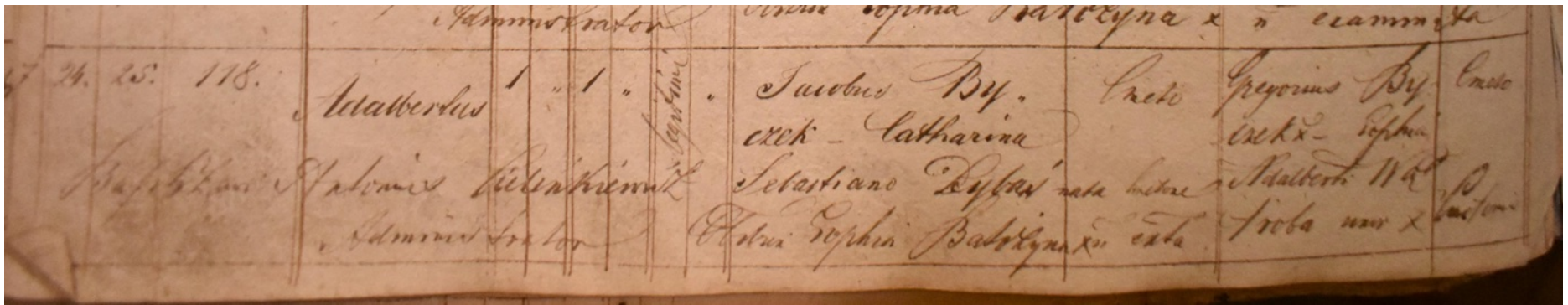

At least three of their children (Martin, John, and Jacob) settled in Chicago, IL as adults. They joined their uncle John Byczek, aunt Hedwig (Byczek) Gnatek, and several relatives from the Byczek and Czarny families.

Their son Martin Byczek married Maryanna (Marianna) Dudek in 1907 after settling in Chicago. They are Michael E. Byczek's great-grandparents. Martin's uncle John (Jan) Byczek (Adalbert's brother) was married to Maryanna's aunt Magdalena Król.

The death records of Adalbert Byczek and Catherine Czarny have not been verified. It is presumed that they are buried at the Osobnica Catholic parish cemetery.

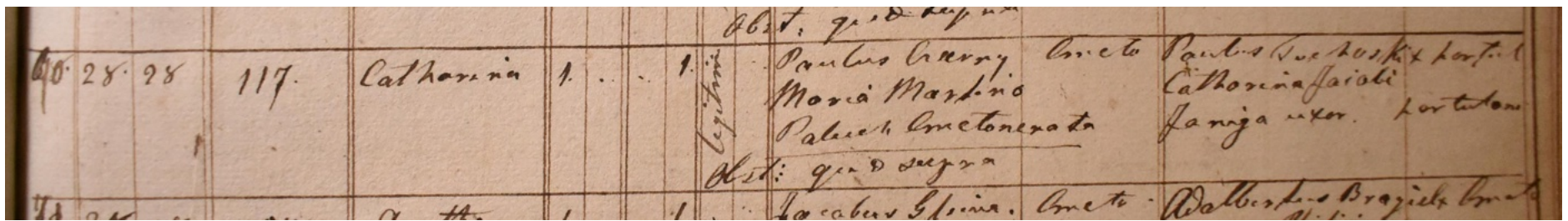
The last verified document for the family in Osobnica was the death of their twin sons Louis and Lawrence in 1893. Their sons Martin, John, and Jacob began to relocate to Chicago, IL in 1903, the same year that Adalbert's mother Catherine (Dybas) Byczek passed away in Osobnica. Research is ongoing to verify whether the three brothers lived in the nearby neighboring villages of Ryglice and Bistuszowa (about 21 miles from Osobnica) prior to their arrival in the United States. Jacob Byczek is verified to have lived in Ryglice when he departed Poland for Chicago, which is listed in his naturalization documents. The passenger lists for Martin and John have not been verified. However, the best candidate passenger records both list villages that were written similarly to Bistuszowa, which is immediately adjacent to Ryglice. It is unknown whether their parents Adalbert and Catherine, or other brothers (Joseph, Andrew, and Peter) remained in Osobnica during this time period. It does not appear that either Adalbert or Catherine traveled to Chicago, but the names Joseph, Andrew, and Peter appear in records for the Bridgeport neighborhood.

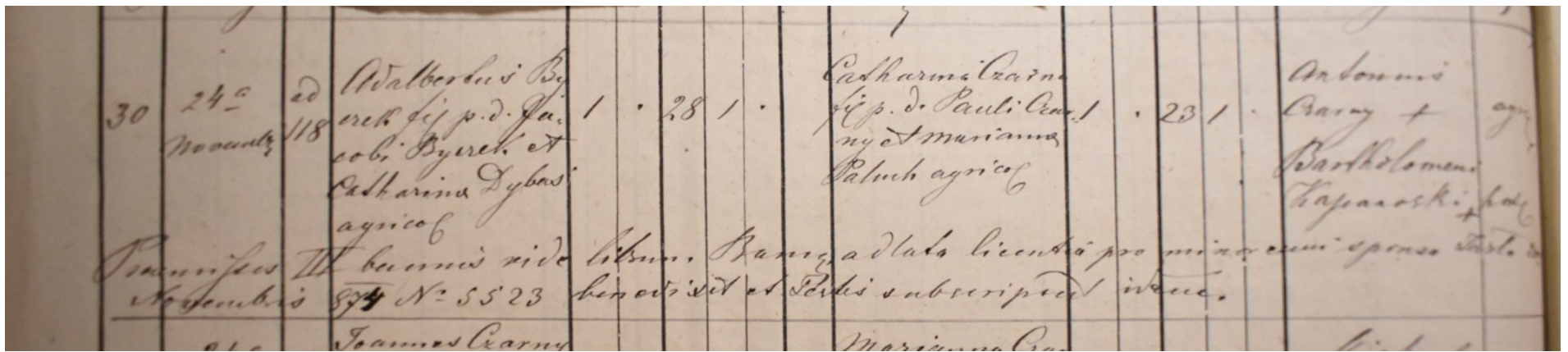

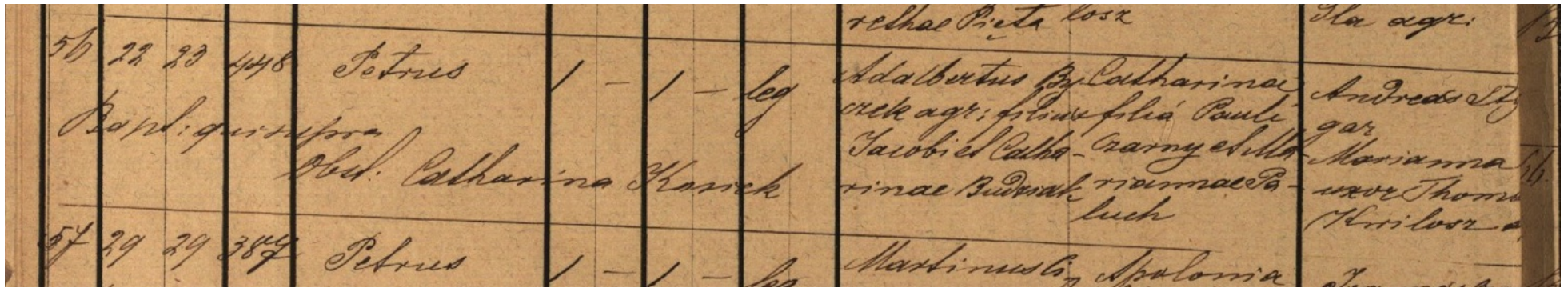

Genealogical Coincidences

The Adalbert Byczek and Catherine Czarny family in Osobnica is a perfect example of the due diligence necessary in genealogical research. In 1873, one year before their marriage, there was another wedding at the same church in Osobnica for a different Adalbert Byczek and Catherine Czarny.

This “other” Adalbert Byczek was born about 1851 compared to 1846. His parents were Gregory Byczek and Frances Lesniak. The “other” Catherine Czarny was born about 1852 compared to 1851. Her parents were Thomas Czarny and Marianna Kwilosz. The marriage was listed for House #184 in Osobnica. Both families had children born and baptized in Osobnica during the same period of years.

The most crucial fact to consider is that members from both families relocated to Chicago, IL. The “other” Adalbert Byczek and Catherine Czarny traveled to Chicago together with their children. The family that is the subject of this documentary (Michael E. Byczek’s 2x-great-grandparents) had at least three sons (Martin, John, and Jacob) who settled in Chicago at the same time that the other family lived in the city. At first glance, it might appear that these records refer to a single family. It remains unknown exactly how the two families are related.

Byczek (grandfather) married Marie Flanagan in 1950 at St. Bridget's in Bridgeport. Their eldest child Michael M. Byczek (father) married Betty A. Bykowski in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children. Michael E. Byczek is the eldest and was born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.

Osobnica is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Jasło, within Jasło County, Subcarpathian Voivodeship, in south-eastern Poland.
