Joseph Bykowski and Margaret Piotrowski

Joseph Bykowski and Margaret Piotrowski were married at the Catholic church located in Witowo (Kuyavian-Pomeranian Voivodeship in north-central Poland) on 9/17/1907.

Joseph was the son of Lawrence Bykowski and Martha Januszewski. He was born in Miałkie within the Świerczyn Catholic parish on 3/12/1882. At the time of the marriage, Joseph was living with his mother, who had remarried as a widow, in Niegibalice within the Byton Catholic parish.

Margaret was the daughter of Joseph Piotrowski and Victoria Nowakowski. She was born in Kolonia Opatowice within the Radziejów Catholic parish on 6/9/1887. At the time of the marriage, Margaret was living with her parents in Pscinno, within the Witowo parish.

Joseph Bykowski had served in the Russian infantry for three years between 1904-1907, as the area in Poland was under Russian geopolitical governance.

Their son Roman Bykowski (Michael E. Byczek's grandfather) was born in Czarnotki within the Piotrkow Kujawski Catholic parish on 7/23/1908. Shortly after Roman's birth, Joseph Bykowski traveled to Chicago, IL to join his brother-in-law Felix Piotrowski in the Bucktown neighborhood on Damen and Webster. In 1911, when Roman was three years old, he and his mother, along with Margaret's sister Charlotte Piotrowski, joined Joseph in Chicago passing through Ellis Island in New York.

Joseph Bykowski is best remembered as the proprietor of a small neighborhood grocery store in the Bucktown neighborhood of Chicago located on the corner of Hoyne and Charleston during, at least, the 1920s and 1930s.

Tragedy struck the Bykowski family in 1919 when seven year old Mary Bykowski was killed by a truck as she played outside near the family home in Bucktown. Margaret witnessed her daughter being struck and dragged down the street by the truck. She desperately ran after the truck because the driver did not stop with Mary trapped underneath. Margaret never recovered from the trauma. Her sister Charlotte had recently passed away during the Spanish Flu. The double tragedy left Margaret with a mental health crisis.

Margaret's great-grandson Michael E. Byczek is an attorney and is very familiar with medical technology and how treatments have advanced through the years. Unfortunately, mental health treatment during this time period was extremely ineffective and did not adequately treat the patient. As a result, Margaret's condition

worsened. She became a patient at the Elgin State Hospital (Elgin, IL) as early as the 1920s. She eventually became a permanent resident of the facility and was diagnosed with insanity by doctors. She remained at the facility through her death in 1970. Michael E. Byczek pays tribute to his great-grandmother as a woman who just a few years prior to the 1919 tragedy was able to bring her three year old son Roman (grandfather) from Poland to Chicago accompanied only by her younger sister Charlotte. Margaret was quite capable of international travel with a young child (with their belongings) and raised a family in the Bucktown neighborhood through the 1920s. Grief eventually became too much for Margaret to cope. She did not receive the proper mental health treatment that is available in modern times.

Joseph Bykowski passed away on 10/30/1963 in Chicago. He was living with his daughter at 3117 N. New England in the Montclare neighborhood at the time of his death. However, he maintained a phone number at 1852 N. Damen in Bucktown through his death. Margaret (Piotrowski) Bykowski passed away on 5/26/1970 in Elgin, IL at the Elgin State Hospital. She had been known as "Maggie" as a patient at the facility. Her funeral was held at St. William Catholic church in the Montclare neighborhood of Chicago. Joseph and Margaret are buried together at St. Adalbert Cemetery in Niles, IL.



There were 3 premarital announcements published on 3 next sundays on: 19 August (1 September), 26 August (8 September) and 2 (15) September 1907 in Witowo and Bytoń parish churches. Bride's father gave oral permition for the marriage. Newlyweds didnt made premarital agreement. Wedding ceremony provided by the priest Jan Szafrański, Witowo parish administrator. Act was read aloud to the illiterate newlyweds and witnesses signed only by Us, Witowo parish administrator and serving as Civil Registrar priest Jan Szafrański.

Federal Documents

It is unclear whether Joseph and Margaret were formally naturalized as American citizens. Both of them, and their son Roman, registered as non-citizen Aliens during World War II in accordance with federal law. The documents suggest that neither Joseph nor Margaret had filed for citizenship. Roman was in the process of naturalization and completed his citizenship shortly afterwards.

The fact that all three filed these federal forms (Alien Registration) is evidence that the entire family was in full compliance with immigration laws. However, naturalization papers have not been found for Joseph or Margaret. It's possible that neither finished the process, which is why the initial documents have not been indexed.

Joseph requested and was granted a social security number four years prior to the Alien Registration Act, but his death certificate listed that he was a citizen of Poland. Margaret's death certificate showed that she was using her husband's social security number, but that she was an American citizen.

Joseph Bykowski registered for the military draft during World War II, also in compliance with federal procedure.

Michael E. Byczek has reviewed these documents and has concluded that his great-grandparents both probably filed, at least, an initial petition but may not have completed the paperwork. The 1919 tragedy may have altered the family's priorities.

The Bykowski family suffered unimaginable tragedy shortly after arriving in the United States. They complied with federal law, as evidenced by the Alien Registration Act and World War II military draft, but may not have completed all necessary steps that a family without such catastrophic grief would have fulfilled. Michael E. Byczek has determined that it is proper to pay tribute to both Joseph and Margaret as Americans, even through they may not have finalized their naturalization papers.



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












1917 Joseph Bykowski at 2064 N. Hoyne Presumed to be the correct Joseph


