

## Patrick J. Flanagan and Anna Kane

Patrick J. Flanagan and Anna Kane were married at Sacred Heart Catholic church in the Pilsen neighborhood of Chicago on 9/2/1886.

Patrick was the son of James Flanagan and Bridget Gaharn. The Flanagan family settled in Port Huron, MI around 1865 from Ireland. On balance of probabilities, it is more likely than not, and highly plausible that Patrick was born in Collinstown, County Westmeath (Ireland) in 1856. Refer to the James Flanagan and Bridget Gaharn documentary for detailed analysis of these documents. Patrick was baptized at the Collinstown Catholic church on 11/23/1856. The church did not list date of birth.

Anna Kane was the daughter of Patrick Kane and Bridget Rochford. She was born in 1861 in Claremorris, County Mayo (Ireland) and baptized at the Kilcolman Catholic church on 9/15/1861. The church did not list the date of birth. Anna settled in Chicago, IL from Claremorris around 1881 along with her two brothers Martin and John Kane.

Patrick relocated to Chicago from Port Huron around 1884. His sisters Catherine and Mary and brother John also lived in Chicago, at least on a temporary basis. Patrick remained in Chicago for the rest of his life while his siblings relocated elsewhere.

The Flanagan surname was also spelled with a variety of phonetic versions, such as Flannigan, Flanigan, and Flannagan. The Kane surname was also spelled Keane. Anna was also written as Ann, Anne, and Annie.

Patrick Flanagan and Anna Kane had a total of nine children, all born in Chicago:

Their son Martin J. Flanagan, a World War I veteran, married Marie T. Talbot (granddaughter of William and Julia Rooney, prominent Old Settlers of Chicago), at Holy Name Cathedral in 1922. They are Michael E. Byczek's great-grandparents.


Patrick Flanagan primarily worked as a laborer. This included jobs in construction and as a watchman.

Anna (Kane) Flanagan was listed in 1938 as five foot and two inches tall.

Patrick Flanagan passed away on 11/11/1908 at the age of 51 while living at 3525 S. Paulina in the McKinley Park neighborhood of Chicago. His funeral was held at Our Lady of Good Counsel Catholic church on 35th and Hermitage, near the Flanagan family home.

Anna (Kane) Flanagan passed away on 1/21/1941 at the age of 79 while living at 1749 W. 59th St in the West Englewood neighborhood of Chicago. Her funeral was held at St. Theodore on 62nd and Paulina, near her home.

Patrick and Anna Flanagan are buried together in their family plot at Olivet Cemetery in Chicago, IL along with their children Martin, Margaret, and John.




1856 Patrick Flanagan Baptism

A baptism took place in Collinstown on November 23, 1856 that is a near perfect match for the Flanagan family. The record is somewhat illegible. The baby's name is Patrick.

The father's name is Jacob Flanagan. Jacob is a formal variation of James used for Catholic records. In fact, James was called Jacob in Port Huron for his son John's baptism in 1867.

The mother's first name is Bridget. Her maiden name appears to start the with the letters "Gagh" followed by two or three letters.

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# OBITUARY

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**Patrick Flanagan.**

Mrs. Capt. McCullouch and sister, Mrs. W. Hogwood, of this city, have just returned from Chicago, Ill., where they were called very suddenly to attend the funeral of their oldest brother, Patrick Flanagan, who was an old resident of Port Huron, who died after three days' illness of pneumonia. He leaves a wife and eight children. His funeral was very largely attended by relatives and friends. It occurred at the Church of Good Council where high mass was celebrated by the Rev. Father Morrisy, followed by a sermon. The floral offerings were numerous and beautiful. His remains were laid in the family lot at Mt. Olivet. He was a son of Mrs. James Flanagan, of 1113 Kearney street, this city.

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## *The Flanagan family and United States Citizenship*

A strict interpretation of the law would conclude that James Flanagan, his wife Bridget, and their Irish born children (Patrick, Mary, and Catherine) were not citizens of the United States.

Michael E. Byczek, 3x-great-grandson of James Flanagan, is an Illinois attorney and has reviewed family documents from Chicago and Port Huron regarding their citizenship status. He has concluded that it is proper to pay tribute to the Flanagan family as if they were American citizens as of 1866 while residents of Port Huron, MI.

The misinterpretation originates in 1865 when James Flanagan filed his first papers followed by a duplicate one year later instead of the final papers required to become a citizen. Michael E. Byczek has concluded this was not the fault of his 3x-great-grandfather.

Documents show that James Flanagan may not have been able to read or write. Court records suggest that he did not understand the intricacy of legal documents, the complexity of law, or government-imposed procedures.

A fictional, but plausible, chronology of events are described as follows:

1865: James Flanagan walked into a government office and announced his intentions to become an American citizen. The government official instructed James to fill out a form and return in one year to complete another document.

1866: After waiting one year, James Flanagan returned to the government office and again announced that he wanted to become a citizen. The government official told him to fill out a document and go home. James Flanagan did so, and told his entire family that they had become American citizens.

In such a scenario, James Flanagan had the sincere intention of becoming an American citizen, followed the procedures to the best of his ability, and lived the rest of his life proud to be a citizen of the United States, despite the lack of a final review of his paperwork or administration of an oath. James Flanagan would not have understood these requirements or procedure.

Both James and Bridget Flanagan passed away in Port Huron believing they were American citizens. Patrick Flanagan told Anna Kane that when they were married, she would become a citizen through marriage. He spent the rest of his life believing that he was an American citizen.

Anna (Kane) Flanagan spent her entire widowhood proud to be an American citizen until her sister-in-law discovered that her father did not file final papers. Anna Flanagan immediately proceeded to become a citizen in her own right in 1938. She passed away just three years later.

In her naturalization documents, Anna (Kane) Flanagan stated:

Given the question “I was informed by the following-named person or persons that I was a citizen of the United States”, Anna answered:

*About Sept. 1886, from about the time we were married, my husband told me he was a citizen of the U.S. by naturalization of his father James Flanagan in Pt. Huron, Mich. In about March 1919 when women were starting to vote I registered to vote being as I thought my husband had been a citizen.*

With regard to the question of “I continued as above indicated until the date shown below when I became apprised under the following circumstances that my impression was erroneous”, Anna replied:

*About Sept. 1937 my sister-in-law Cather Hogwood, sent me her father's papers and I found that they were only 1st papers and that he had never taken final papers.*


Anna further explained, given the question “I have exercised the following rights and duties of a citizen of the United States”, that:

*I have voted since March 1919. I had one son, Martin Flanagan, in the World War.*

For these reasons, Michael E. Byczek pays tribute to his 2x-great-grandparents Patrick Flanagan and Anna Kane along with his 3x-great-grandparents James Flanagan and Bridget Gaharn as if they were American citizens. 

## Address Chronology


- 1886: Marriage at Sacred Heart (19th and Peoria in the Pilsen neighborhood)  
The church is most likely where Anna, at minimum, was a parishioner.
- 1887: 1330 W. 18th Street  
James was baptized at St. Pius (19th and Ashland in Pilsen). The address listed on the delayed birth certificate filed in 1939 may not have been accurate, but most likely was near the church.
- 1888: Martin baptized at Holy Family (Roosevelt and Racine in the Near West Side).  
The family most likely lived near the church.
- 1890-1891: Anna and Mary baptized at Sacred Heart, thus the family most likely lived near the church.
- 1893: 166 W. Jackson Blvd. (present-day 741 W. Jackson) in the West Loop.  
Not verified, but highly likely. It appears that Patrick's brother and both sisters were associated with the same building.
- 1894-1907 3809 S. Lincoln (now Wolcott Ave) in McKinley Park
- 1908-1918 3525 S. Paulina St. in McKinley Park
- 1919: 5623 S. Ashland Ave in West Englewood
- 1920: 7331 S. Racine Ave in Englewood
- 1923-1941 1749 W. 59th Street in West Englewood








