Michael E. Byczek's 5x-great-grandfather Joseph Mordel was the son of Frank and Barbara Mordel. The only information about Joseph's birth is from the first verified document for his family following his own marriage - a baptism in Bodzanowo within the Byczyna Catholic parish. The best estimate for Joseph's birth was about 1782.

There was a Frank Mordel and Barbara Kośmider family that lived in Płowki within the Broniewo parish that, on balance of probabilities, is the same family versus two families with the same names.

Płowki and Bodzanowo are about 11 miles apart.

Barbara Mordel, wife of Frank Mordel, passed away in 1790 while living in Płowki. She died from an accidental drowning. This required the priest to identify witnesses as to Barbara's Catholic values. One of the witnesses was her brother Thomas Kośmider. This implies that Barbara's maiden name was Kośmider.

Third party transcriptions on the website <https://geneteka.genealodzy.pl> shows multiple Kośmider families in Płowki during a period when the village was also associated with the Chełmce Catholic parish. One of those individuals was Thomas Kośmider. This suggests that both the Kośmider and Mordel families were from the same village and parish.

There is a death record for Frank Mordel in 1815, also in Płowki.

Based upon these death records, Frank was born about 1745 and Barbara about 1740.

One baptism for children of Frank and Barbara Mordel, a daughter Marianna in 1775, took place in Płowki. It is unknown where or when Joseph Mordel was born, or whether there were other children baptized within or near the Broniewo parish.

Płowki.

On the 10th of September (1790), I likewise buried in the walled cemetery a woman named **Barbara**, wife of **Franciszek Mord...** [surname slightly cut off].

She was about **50 years of age**. She died suddenly, apparently having been **drowned in water**, yet she had not previously confessed or received the sacraments of communion. Nevertheless, she was always known to have lived in the Christian manner, as was attested by **Łukasz Panka, Sobiesław (Sebastian) Panska, Tomasz Kośmider her full brother, Władysław Banaszak**, and many others from the same village of Królewska (Regalis), both sworn and unsworn witnesses. Therefore she was judged worthy of ecclesiastical burial.

Płowki.

It happened in the settlement of Lipno on the 14th day of the month of November in the year 1815 at 9 o'clock in the morning. Appeared **Marcin Gorzdyński, aged 60**, and **Maciej Wrzesiński, aged 30**, both residents of Płowki, and declared that in his own home in the settlement of Płowki, **Franciszek Mordel** had died, aged **70 years**, a peasant of the settlement of Płowki, husband of the late **Barbara**.

He died on the 14th of November of the present year at 1 o'clock in the afternoon. After personal confirmation of the death of Franciszek Mordel, this act was read aloud to the appearing witnesses and signed by me, since the witnesses do not know how to write.

Ukadzielewo It happened in Rodzewo on the fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred thirty-seven, at ten o'clock in the morning, Kadomo, that in the presence of the witnesses Jan Kowalkowski, Zofa, newly married, a farmer, thirty-three years old, and Leon Prwicki, sixty-six years old, both of whom, on their children's day, a religious marriage was concluded between Józef Hordel, a Catholic laborer, a widow, since the year one thousand eight hundred thirty-one here in Kadzye, a resident of Płow Rach, born to Franiczek and Barbara Merdel, already deceased, fifty-one years old, and Mrs. Aszowicz Ziaki, the first wife of the family. Miaznikowska, a widow of Kurowicka, has been living here in Kasi, residing and born to Andrzej and Kata nysza Sakubińska, forty-eight years old. This marriage was preceded by three announcements on the twenty-ninth day of January, Brugin, February of this year. The marriage did not take place. The spouses declare that they did not enter into a marriage contract. This act was read to the appearing persons and witnesses who cannot write. Afli Brozoski Rob Rada

Frank Mordel and Barbara Kośmider are Michael E. Byczek's 6x-great-grandparents. Their son Joseph Mordel (5x-great-grandfather) married Margaret Mikolaj in about 1805. Their daughter Hedwig Mordel (4x-great-grandmother) married Vincent Nowakowski in 1827 in Radziejow. Their son John Nowakowski (3x-great-grandfather) married Catherine Kocinski in 1857, also in Radziejow. Their daughter Victoria Nowakowski (2x-great-grandmother) married Joseph Piotrowski in 1876, also in Radziejow. Their daughter Margaret Piotrowski (great-grandmother) married Joseph Bykowski in 1907 in Witowo prior to settling in Chicago, IL. Their son Roman Bykowski (grandfather) arrived in the United States when he was three years old. The family lived in the Bucktown neighborhood of Chicago. Roman married Antoinette Murzynowicz/Marynowski in 1936 at St. Stanislaus Kostka in the Pulaski Park neighborhood. Their daughter Betty A. Bykowski (mother) married Michael M. Byczek in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley. They have two children, Michael E. Byczek (the eldest) and Katherine S. Byczek, both born in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago.
