Joseph Mordel and Margaret Mikolaj raised their family in proximity of the Radziejow Catholic parish. They were probably married around 1805. It is unknown where either Joseph or Margaret were born, or where they were married.

Joseph was the son of Frank and Barbara Mordel. Barbara's maiden name is unknown. The family surname was spelled with multiple variations over the years. These include Mordel, Mordylewski, and Morelewski. Michael E. Byczek has determined that Mordel is an accurate spelling of their surname until more documents have been found. The best estimate for Joseph's birth is 1782.

Margaret's parents are unknown. Records from this time period do not always include a maiden name. There are multiple references to a Joseph and Margaret Mordel family in the area with a maiden name of Mikolaj and Mikolajczak. On balance of probabilities, these documents refer to a single family versus the coincidence of multiple families with the same names. The best estimate for Margaret's birth is 1792. Michael E. Byczek has determined that Mikolaj is an accurate spelling until more documents have been verified.

Joseph and Margaret Mordel appear to have had at least ten children. The birth and baptisms took place at several different locations (in close proximity), but several of the names have been verified as their children:

Their daughter Hedwig Mordel married Vincent Nowakowski in 1827 at the Radziejow church. They are Michael E. Byczek's 4x-great-grandparents. The record listed that Hedwig was born in Bodzanowo, but did not provide her mother's maiden name.

Most of the Mordel baptism records are not available online. The only actual baptism that has been acquired is for Andrew in 1822. The above list is mostly derived from third-party transcriptions, which are not always accurate. Andrew was also born in Bodzanowo and listed the mother's name as Margaret Mikolaj. Therefore, the two documents, collectively, highly suggests, that it is more likely than not, that the maiden name of Hedwig (Mordel) Nowakowski's mother was Mikolaj/Mikolajczak.

Margaret (Mikolaj) Mordel passed away in 1831 while the family lived in the Radziejow parish. Her maiden name was not listed on the death record. The village has not yet been located on a present-day map. The village may have been Radziejow itself.

Joseph Mordel remarried in 1837 to Apolonia Jakubowski at the church in Radziejow. Her parents were Andrew and Catherine Jakubowski. She had been twice previously married. At the time of the 1837 marriage, she was the widow of John Kurowski. They had been married in 1831 in Radziejow. At the time, it appears that Apolonia had been the widow of Jacob Miecznikowski who died in 1830 in Radziejow. They appear to have been married in 1806 in Radziejow.

Joseph Mordel passed away in 1847 while living in Pscininek within the Witowo parish. The death record listed the names of his children and referred to both marriages to Margaret and Apolonia.

Apolonia's death record has not been verified.

Joseph's children were listed in his death record as Paul, Andrew, Marianna, Agatha, Marciana, Hedwig, and Josephine. This list is presumed to refer to only those children still living. The distinction between Marianna and Marciana could involve an interpretation of the three baptism transcriptions for Marianna/Maryanna. The baptisms for Paul and Josephine have not been found, actual or transcription.

It happened on the 24th day of November 1822 at 7 p.m. In front of Us, Byczyna parish parson and Civil Registrar for Byczyna community, Radziejów county, Mazowieckie voivodeship appeared Józef Mordylewski, farmer living in Bodzanowo, 40 years old and presented Us a male child born in his house number 7 on the 20th day of November of the current year at midnight.

He declared that he child was born with him and his wife Małgorzata nee Mikołaj, 30 years old and that his wish is to give the child name Andrzej.

After this declaration and presentation of the child was made in the presence of Jakób Bielak, farmhand serving in Bodzanowo, 31 years old and Grzegorz Małczak, farmer living in Bodzanowo, 61 years old this birth record was read aloud to the declarants, all illiterate and was signed by Us.

Ukadzielewo It happened in Rodzewo on the fourth day of February, one thousand eight hundred thirty-seven, at ten o'clock in the morning, Kadomo, that in the presence of the witnesses Jan Kowalkowski, Zofa, newly married, a farmer, thirty-three years old, and Leon Prwicki, sixty-six years old, both of whom, on their children's day, a religious marriage was concluded between Józef Hordel, a Catholic laborer, a widow, since the year one thousand eight hundred thirty-one here in Kadzye, a resident of Płow Rach, born to Franiczek and Barbara Merdel, already deceased, fifty-one years old, and Mrs. Aszolowicz Ziaki, the first wife of the family. Miaznikowska, a widow of Kurowicka, has been living here in Kasi, residing and born to Andrzej and Kata nysza Sakubińska, forty-eight years old. This marriage was preceded by three announcements on the twenty-ninth day of January, Brugin, February of this year. The marriage did not take place. The spouses declare that they did not enter into a marriage contract. This act was read to the appearing persons and witnesses who cannot write. Afli Brozoski Rob Rada

The city of Radzejowo. It took place in the city of Radzejowo on the eleventh day of May, eight hundred and thirty-one, at four o'clock in the afternoon. We are aware that in the presence of witnesses, Jan Mllee, fifty-five years old, and Jan Kowałkowski, twenty-eight years old, the latter of whom is the son-in-law of the new spouse of both. The citizens of the village of Rudziców, residing here, on the sixth day of the month, a religious marriage was concluded between Janen Kurowicka Kotolika, a citizen residing in the city of Molsk, a widower who died on the twenty-ninth day of January, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-ten, Margherita of Raluca, in the city of Molsk, the son of Paweł Ilronek of the Kurowicki family and deceased, born in Subin, fifty-eight years old, and Mrs. Asolonia Mieśnikowska, née Jakobowska, a citizen of Kadziola. Daughter of Arong Katarina Jakobowski, no longer living, born in Rajów, forty-five years old, Adowa, after Jakob Mainikowski, who died here in Rohejów on the eleventh day of April, eighteen hundred and thirty. This marriage is preceded by Urza's announcement on the seventeenth day of April, twenty-fourth, one year ago, of the current parish. The Mey and Molski families declare that no prenuptial agreement has been entered into. This act was read to the declarants and witnesses by Us, the declarant and the Swadek family.

Additional Information

Joseph Mordel and Margaret Mikolaj are Michael E. Byczek's 5x-great-grandparents. Their daughter Hedwig Mordel (4x-great-grandmother) married Vincent Nowakowski in 1827 in Radziejow. Their son John Nowakowski (3x-great-grandfather) married Catherine Kocinski in 1857, also in Radziejow. Their daughter Victoria Nowakowski (2x-great-grandmother) married Joseph Piotrowski in 1876, also in Radziejow. Their daughter Margaret Piotrowski (great-grandmother) married Joseph Bykowski in 1907 in Witowo prior to settling in Chicago, IL. Their son Roman Bykowski (grandfather) arrived in the United States when he was three years old. The family lived in the Bucktown neighborhood of Chicago. Roman married Antoinette Murzynowicz/Marynowski in 1936 at St. Stanislaus Kostka in the Pulaski Park neighborhood. Their daughter Betty A. Bykowski (mother) married Michael M. Byczek in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley. They have two children, Michael E. Byczek (the eldest) and Katherine S. Byczek, both born in the Bridgeport neighborhood of Chicago.

- Czalpin is probably a transcription mistake for Czołpin (a village in the administrative district of Gmina Dobre)
- Witowo is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Bytoń
- Pścinek is a village in the administrative district of Gmina Bytoń

Michael E. Byczek has been compiling actual records for the Mordel family through Catholic church records in Poland for over the past ten or more years with direct messages to diocese archives and access to digitized microfilm. He has gathered an extensive collection of documents. This compiled documentary is an accurate source of genealogy for Joseph Mordel and Margaret Mikolaj.
