## John Nowakowski and Bridget Metlewicz

John and Bridget Nowakowski raised their family in Opatowice within the Radziejow Catholic parish.

There is uncertainty about Bridget's maiden name:

- 1. There is a marriage from Radziejow in 1793 between Jan Nowak and Brygida Szymkowna. The marriage is listed under Opatowice. This is the best candidate for their marriage, but that surname does not appear in any other document. It is possible that Bridget was a widow (Szymkowna/Szymkowski was her married name), or that these are two different families.
- 2. Their son Vincent's baptism record in 1808 listed his mother's maiden name as Metlewicz. Given the time period of baptism records for Radziejow, this may have been the first baptism where the mother's maiden name was identified. The witness and godfather for Vincent had the same surname.
- 3. John Nowakowski's death record appears to list a surname similar to Gralikwicz. However, this surname does not appear in any other document.

Vincent Nowakowski is verified to have been the son of John and Bridget Nowakowski (without a maiden name) from Opatowice and was born about 1808.

Therefore, based on balance of probabilities, Bridget's maiden name was Metlewicz pending further review of documents for the Radziejow parish.

It's possible that John Nowakowski's surname may have been Nowak in earlier times, but the 1793 marriage would be one of the only documents that did not use Nowakowski.

Based on Vincent's baptism record in 1808, it would appear that John was born around 1768 and Bridget in 1778. These numbers are close to their death records. The best candidate death record for John shows an estimated birth of 1763 and Bridget as 1776.

It appears, from the presumed death record of John Nowakowski, that his parents were Frank and Rosalie Nowakowski. Rosalie's maiden name was not listed.

John and Bridget Nowakowski had at least seven children, all born in Opatowice (Radziejow parish):

Their son Vincent Nowakowski married Hedwig Mordel in 1827 at the Radziejow church. They are Michael E. Byczek's 4x-great-grandparents.

The best candidate death records for John Nowakowski is 1840 and Bridget in 1842. Both were living in Opatowice (Radziejow parish).

1840 Death for John Nowakowski Opatowice (Radziejow Parish)

Opatowicz. This took place in the city of Kołobrzeg on the twenty-first day of February, 1840, at nine o'clock in the morning.

32. Jan Nowakowski, forty years old, and Wimińky, twenty-seven years old, both farmers, settled in Opatowice, appeared and declared that on the twentieth day of this month, at ten o'clock in the evening, Jan Nowakowski, a Catholic, a farmer born in Opatowice, died, and his wife, Rozała Nowakowski, seventy years old, left a beautiful wife, Bygih, from Gralilwez. After learning of Nawaleie's death, this act was read by the presenters, who were not able to write.

Opatowice Ropia Act of the Descent of Bregida Romałońska from the Religious and Civil Books of Sulciewska's wife Sulejów City. It took place in the City of Sulejów on the 1st of March, 16th, 1842, at three o'clock in the afternoon. Antoni Dysiewicz, thirty-eight years old, Commander of the Cistercian Church in Suliejów, and Sranciszel Rotyński, thirty-five years old, a citizen of the village of Kafasze, appeared and declared that on the fourteenth of March of this year at twelve o'clock in the afternoon, Brigina Rowakowska, sixty-six years old, daughter of unknown parents, died here in Suliejów. This act was read to the appearing people and signed by us together with them. Signed by 8 Marieri Nowakowski

1808 Baptism of Vincent Nowakowski Opatowice (Radziejow Parish) Version II

In the year one thousand eight hundred and eight, on the sixteenth day of Opatowice, at twelve o'clock noon, the Radziwiłł Podbasiński, acting as the Civil Registrar of the Radziwiłł Commune, the Radziwiłł Provost in the Bydgoszcz Department, appeared before us, Jan Nowakowski, a forty-year-old peasant residing in Opołowice, and presented us with a male child born in his house under the mayor on the seventh day of June of the current year, declaring that he was the son of himself and Brigitta Metlewicz, née Metlewicz, who was near thirty years old and had been his wife, and that it was his wish to name him Wincenty. After making the above declaration and presenting the Child in the presence of Grzegorz Grolik, a forty-year-old peasant residing in Czołowko, and Bartłomicz Metlewicz, a peasant from the village of Opcatowo in the Radziciowskie commune, which occurred in the year twenty-fourth, this birth certificate was read to the appearing persons and signed only by us, because neither Father Jan Nowakowski nor the witnesses Grzegorz Gralik and Bertłomiej Metlewicz can write. Prince Leopold Wnorowski, Priest of Radziciowski, performing the duties of a Civil Registrar, in the year one thousand eight hundred eighth day of the twentieth.

Their daughter Margaret Piotrowski (great-grandmother) married Joseph Bykowski in 1907 in Witowo prior to settling in Chicago, IL. Their son Roman Bykowski (grandfather) arrived in the United States when he was three years old. The family lived in the Bucktown neighborhood of Chicago. Roman married Antoinette Murzynowicz/Marynowski in 1936 at St. Stanislaus Kostka in the Pulaski Park neighborhood. Their daughter Betty A. Bykowski (mother) married Michael M. Byczek in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children, Michael E. Byczek (the eldest) and Katherine S. Byczek, both born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.
