Martin Staskiewicz and Anna Milewski lived in Buywiszki within the Punsk Catholic Parish. It is unclear whether they spent their entire life in this village or if they also lived outside the Punsk parish. They were most likely married in the early 1760s.

It happened on the 22nd day of July 1813 at 12 o'clock at noon. In front of Us, Puńsk parish parson, serving as Civil Registrar for Puńsk commune located in Łomża department, Sejny county and municipality, appeared Tomasz Staśkiewicz, 40 years old and Wincenty Staśkiewicz, 35 years old, both brothers of the deceased, living in the village Bujwiszki in Puńsk commune and they informed Us that on the 21st day of july of the current year, at 10 a.m. died Andrzej Staśkiewicz, 45 years old, farmers, husband of Regina nee Pojawis, 34 years old, farmer living in the house number 1 located in Bujwiszki, son of Marcin Staśkiewicz and Anna nee Milewska, both already late, former farmers in the village Bujwiszki.

This act was read to the declarants and signed by Us. Witnesses are illiterate.

Additional Information

Martin Staskiewicz and Anna Milewski are Michael E. Byczek's 5x-great-grandparents. Their son Andrew Staskiewicz (4x-great-grandfather) married Regina Pojawis. Their daughter Helena Staskiewicz (3x-great-grandmother) married Ambrose Gryszkiewicz in 1824 in Punsk. Their daughter Agnes Gryszkiewicz (2x-great-grandmother) married Frank Sidor in 1857 in Sejny. Their daughter Rose Sidor (great-grandmother) married Frank Murzyn in 1897 in Sejny. Their daughter Antoinette Murzynowicz (grandmother) was born in Chicago, IL in 1912. The Frank and Rose Murzyn family settled in Chicago, IL on a permanent basis in 1908. The family interchanged Murzynowicz and Marynowski through the 1940s until formally adopting the latter. Antoinette Murzynowicz/Marynowski married Roman Bykowski in 1936 at St. Stanislaus Kostka in the Pulaski Park neighborhood. Their daughter Betty A. Bykowski (mother) married Michael M. Byczek in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children, Michael E. Byczek (the eldest) and Katherine S. Byczek, both born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.

- Puńsk is a village and seat of the Gmina Puńsk in the Sejny County. It is located only 5 km from the border with Lithuania
- Buywiszki does not appear on a present-day map, but is shown on historical maps near Punsk and Sejny
