Michael E. Byczek's 3x-great-grandfather Thomas Talbot was born in Ballinlonty within the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish in County Tipperary (Ireland). He arrived in Taunton, MA during the Irish Famine about 1848. In 1852 Thomas married Hannah McDonald in Taunton before the family settled in Chicago, IL about 1861. Their son Edward H. Talbot, born in Taunton, married Kittie A. Rooney in 1880 at Holy Name Cathedral in Chicago. They are Michael E. Byczek's 2x-great-grandparents.

Naturalization papers verify that Thomas Talbot was born in Ballinlonty. However, the marriage record did not list the names of his parents, even though the documents required the information. Therefore, analysis of records from County Tipperary is the only way to determine the full Talbot lineage.

Thomas Talbot's brother William was living with Thomas in Chicago on 17th and Wentworth when he passed away just prior to the 1871 Chicago Fire. William's obituary, which would have been arranged by his brother Thomas, stated that William was a "native" of Fishmoynne, Co. Tipperary. Ballinlonty and Fishmoynne are adjacent villages on opposite sides of a road. Both villages are part of the Drom and Inch Catholic parish, which provides absolute verification that the Talbot family was from that church and it is where their baptisms took place. At the time, it appears that the church may have been known simply as Drom.

Analysis of baptism records for the Drom and Inch Catholic parish reveal a single Talbot family, John Talbot and Mary Bourke, who had several children. These are the only Talbot baptisms during this time period. Online access to digitized baptism records are limited to those after the birth of Thomas. Earlier records, including Thomas, are from third-party transcriptions, which are not always 100% accurate or complete (i.e. illegible entries). The combination of third-party transcriptions (i.e. Thomas) and digitized records (i.e. William) confirm that John Talbot and Mary Bourke had sons Thomas and William who were about the right age. The baptism of Thomas Talbot is within the range of dates and ages that he used throughout his life. The Talbot surname is very rare in the Drom Parish, suggesting a single family lived in Ballinlonty.

Furthermore, analysis of records for Co. Tipperary show that John Talbot and Mary Bourke were married in the Drom and Inch parish during a time period when there were also very few references to any Talbot family. This suggests that his parents, whoever they were, may have been the only Talbot family from the previous generation in the entire parish. There are unverified online references to a James Talbot and Catherine Howard family who lived in Ballinlonty during the 1810s. Analysis of records for John Talbot and Mary Bourke from Ballinlonty reveal several direct connections between these two families that suggest John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard. Furthermore, unverified online information suggests that Catherine Howard was the daughter of Pierce Howard. The John Talbot and Mary Bourke family from Ballinlonty was directly linked to a prominent resident of Fishmoynne named Pierce Howard.

Thomas Talbot had two nieces (Delia and Nellie) and two nephews (Thomas and William) who also settled in Chicago. Their parents were James Talbot and Ellen Bannon from Ballinlonty, Co. Tipperary. Edward H. Talbot married Delia Talbot after his first wife Kittie A. Rooney passed away in 1899. There is enough family knowledge about their marriage to conclude that Edward and Delia were first cousins, even though that exact relationship has not been fully verified. Therefore, Thomas and James were brothers. Analysis of records from Ballinlonty show a direct link between the families of James Talbot and Ellen Talbot with John Talbot and Mary Bourke to indicate two successive generations.

Michael E. Byczek undertook extensive genealogical and historical research of Talbot families throughout Co. Tipperary that included birth, marriage, death, burial, land ownership, diocese archives, and newspapers. On balance of probabilities, it is highly plausible and more likely than not that:

1. Thomas Talbot was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke from Ballinlonty.
2. John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard, who lived in Ballinlonty, at least, during the 1810s.
3. Catherine (Howard) Talbot's father was Pierce Howard.

The genealogical analysis of all known documents support the conclusion that Michael E. Byczek is the (1) 4x-great-grandson of John Talbot and Mary Bourke; (2) 5x-great-grandson of James Talbot and Catherine Howard; and (3) 6x-great-grandson of Pierce Howard.

Research is ongoing with a strong likelihood that relevant documents are available to fully determine, without doubt, this blood lineage of Thomas Talbot is accurate. It is therefore proper for Michael E. Byczek to identify himself as their direct blood descendant. It is possible that answers to these questions may never be known. Objective analysis of actual records is the only means, at present, to infer the Talbot lineage of Chicago, IL and Ballinlonty, Co. Tipperary.

The John Talbot and Mary Bourke Family

John Talbot and Mary Bourke were married in 1818 at the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish of County Tipperary, Ireland. They had six children who have been verified through baptism records (dates of birth were not listed in these records). While these documents do not show a son James, there are several possible explanations.

Observations

Online access to actual baptism ledger books begin shortly before Mary Talbot's baptism in 1828. The earlier baptisms are derived from third-party transcriptions, which are not always reliable.

The only reference to when James Talbot was born was his death record which suggested the year 1822 (based upon his age). There is a three year gap between Catherine and Thomas (1820-1823) that could suggest another child.

There were two sons named William. It was common during this time period to reuse the name of a deceased child. However, death and burial records do not exist for this time period to determine whether or not the first William Talbot died between 1826-1833:

1. Michael E. Byczek has documented across multiple branches of his Irish lineage for men and women to use a different name than given at baptism. In fact, James Talbot's daughter Delia Talbot (Michael E. Byczek's step-great-great-grandmother) used the name Delia, which is a derivation of Bridget.
2. There is a possibility that James Talbot may have been baptized as William, but did not use that name.
3. There are numerous examples of errors throughout church records, including the wrong surnames and transcriptions that merged multiple events.
4. Many pages of Co. Tipperary church records are illegible.
5. James Talbot may have been baptized in a different church, or even a different county in Ireland.

For these reasons, Michael E. Byczek cannot determine with absolute certainty whether or not John Talbot and Mary Bourke did or did not have a son James. The records are inconclusive, but show a very high likelihood of being true.

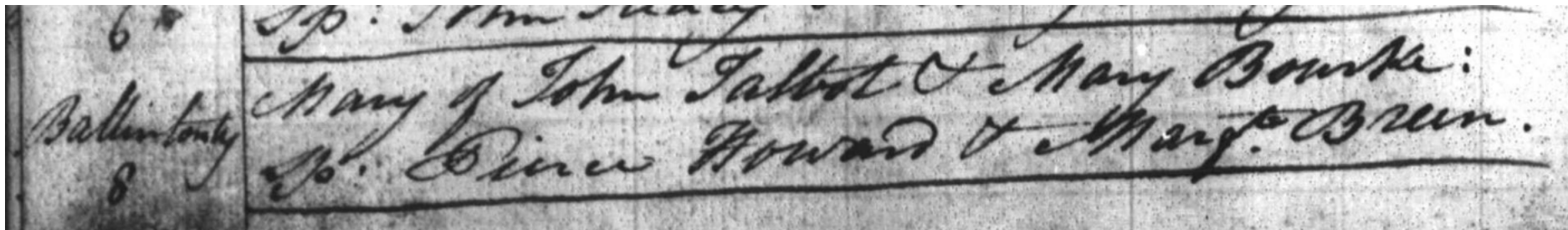

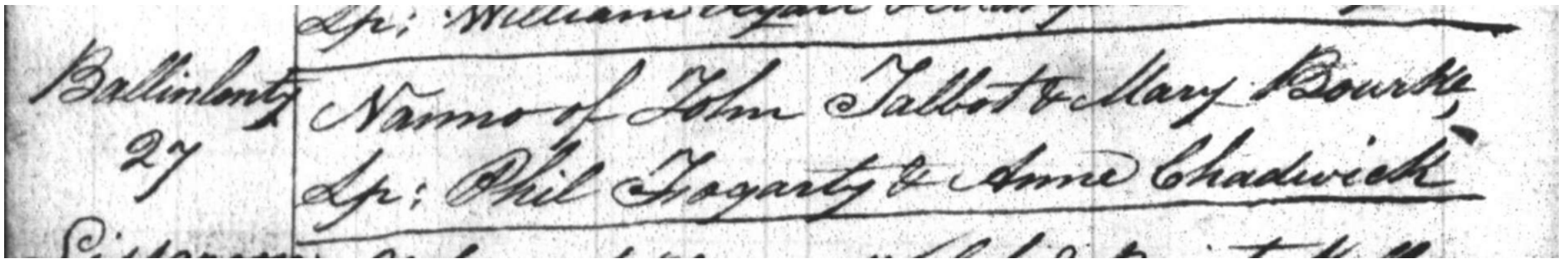
Transcript of William Talbot Baptism

It is presumed that this William passed away as a child, since a younger child was also named William. It is possible that one of these children used a different name or that the baptism record was a mistake. For example, this William could be James



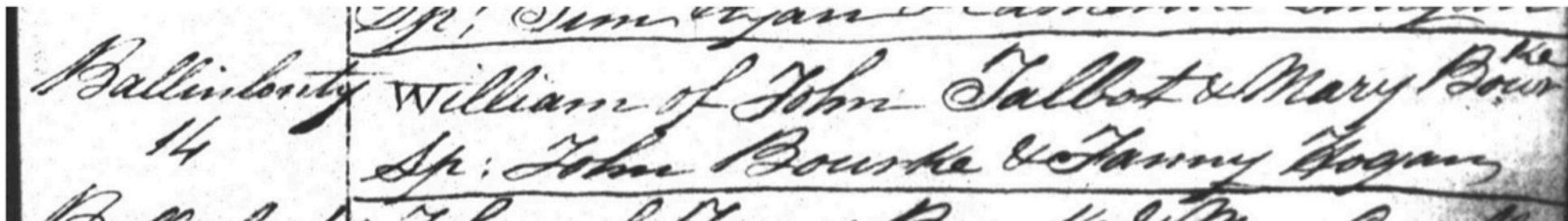
Original Baptism record of Mary Talbot (1828)

1830 Baptism of Nanno Talbot

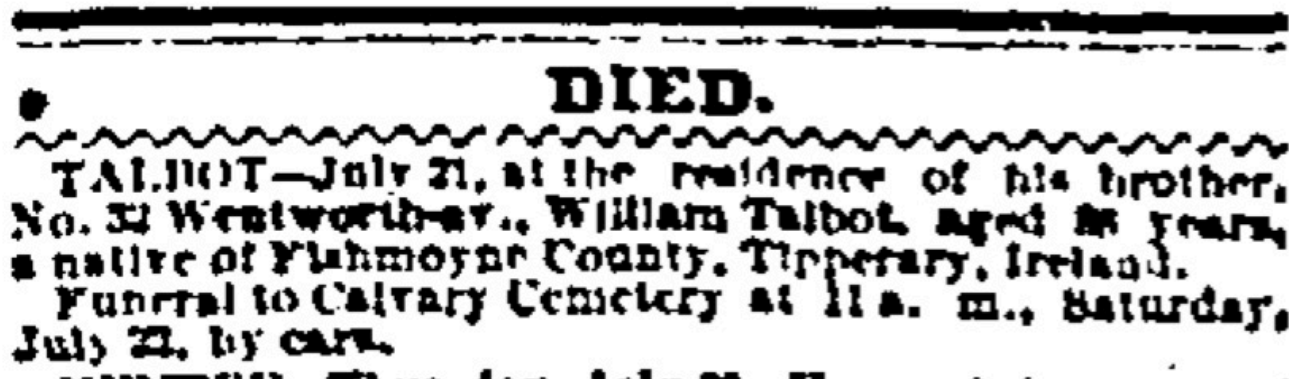
Nanno is a rare variation of Honoria.

Thomas Talbot's brother William passed away in 1871 while living in Chicago, IL together on 17th and Wentworth. Thomas Talbot owned and operated a saloon, with the address of 32 Wentworth at the time. Thomas Talbot arranged the funeral, as William was buried in their family plot at Calvary Cemetery (Evanston, IL). The obituary, that would have been placed by Thomas, stated that William Talbot was from Fishmoynes, Co. Tipperary.

The above baptism in 1833 (other than the earlier 1826 child) is the only possibility for William Talbot within the entire Drom and Inch Catholic parish, regardless of whether he was from Fishmoynes or Ballinlonty.



Chicago Tribune - 7/22/1871

The age is illegible, but could be 36 years. This would suggest a year of birth approximately in 1835.

The James Talbot and Catherine Howard Family

John Talbot married Mary Bourke in the Drom and Inch Parish in 1818. There are only two other meaningful Talbot marriages during that time period:

1. Mary Talbot and Joseph Ryan (1814)
2. Honoria Talbot and James Chadwick (1820)

The three marriages took place within six years of each other, suggesting John, Mary, and Honoria were of the same generation. Furthermore, all three marriages have Pierce Howard in common (such as godfather to their children).

Genealogical research for Mary (Talbot) Ryan specifically states that she was from Ballinlonty and was the daughter of James Talbot and Catherine Howard. This lineage is very conclusive because two of her sons were named James Talbot Ryan and Pierce Howard Ryan as a tribute to Mary's father and maternal grandfather.

Records confirm a prominent resident of Fishmoyne at the time was named Pierce Howard. The name Pierce is a very uncommon name, and individuals named Pierce Howard are extremely rare throughout all Ireland and England over several generations.

Due to probable age ranges, it is unlikely that the Pierce Howard who was godfather to these children was the same Pierce Howard who was the father of Catherine Howard. However, the fact that somebody with that name lived in Fishmoyne is very conclusive that the name and family relationship is accurate. It is reasonable to conclude that the elder Pierce Howard had a son, grandson, or nephew with the same name.

The Chadwick family lived near the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish while the Ryan family relocated to the United States after Mary passed away in the 1830s.

Thomas Howard, from Fishmoyne, was priest for the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish at the time of John Talbot's marriage in 1818. He is credited with building the church. Records show that he was the only prominent Howard in Fishmoyne until his death. Pierce Howard appears in Fishmoyne after the priest's death.

Rev. Thomas Howard passed away in 1826. Two years later, somebody named Pierce Howard is specifically mentioned in a newspaper article as from Fishmoyne. An individual named Pierce Howard was the subject of probate proceedings in 1837, but his date of death and age are unknown. The daughter of a deceased Pierce Howard was married in 1842. Unfortunately, her age was not listed. Local baptism records show the name Pierce Howard was listed as godfather to several babies between 1811 and 1837. This suggests that the name Pierce Howard disappeared after 1837, which corresponds to the probate proceedings. The baptism records also show that there was a Pierce Howard associated with the Drom and Inch Parish fifteen years before the priest Thomas Howard died, yet he does not appear to have been involved with land ownership during this earlier period. This corroborates the conclusion that Pierce Howard was the priest's heir, which shows a very close family relationship.

There is a newspaper reference to Pierce Howard in 1839, two years after the probate proceedings. While this could be an error, it is also possible that there was another Pierce Howard in the area (i.e. father and son).

These facts support the conclusion that an individual named Pierce Howard was the priest's heir and acquired ownership of the Howard land in Fishmoyne. The most likely family relationship scenarios for somebody with the same surname to inherit from a Catholic priest are brother, nephew, great-nephew, or cousin.

Records suggest that James Talbot and Catherine Howard held a prominent status in Ballinlonty during Rev. Thomas Howard's lifetime, yet the Talbot family does not appear to be from the parish. This may suggest that the Talbot family took residence in Ballinlonty because Catherine was related to the priest. The fact that her three presumptive children held Pierce Howard in high regard suggests this individual who inherited from the priest was their uncle (Catherine's brother). This would further suggest that the priest was Catherine's uncle and that her father Pierce Howard was the priest's brother. However, this has not been verified.

The fact that the priest and Pierce Howard passed away about ten years of each other could suggest they were brothers, or that a nephew died younger than would be expected. Without approximate ages, it is difficult to determine whether it was a brother or nephew who inherited from the priest.

It is reasonable to conclude that the 1842 marriage of Pierce Howard's daughter refers to a younger woman. It is also reasonable to conclude that the Pierce Howard who was godfather to several children would have been younger at such time versus an elderly man. The most likely scenario is that the Pierce Howard, who was the priest's heir, was a nephew versus brother.

This may also explain why Thomas Talbot referred to Fishmoyne versus Ballinlonty for his brother William's death in 1871. The Talbot family may have lived in Ballinlonty, but had a significant attachment to Fishmoyne. William Talbot may have even lived on the Howard farm in Fishmoyne prior to settling in Chicago.

It is also possible that the Talbot and Howard land were adjacent properties despite being located in two different present-day villages. Another possibility is that the Talbot land itself spanned both villages.

Mary (Talbot) Ryan

Mary Talbot married Joseph Ryan in 1814 at the Drom and Inch Catholic church. They had eight known children:

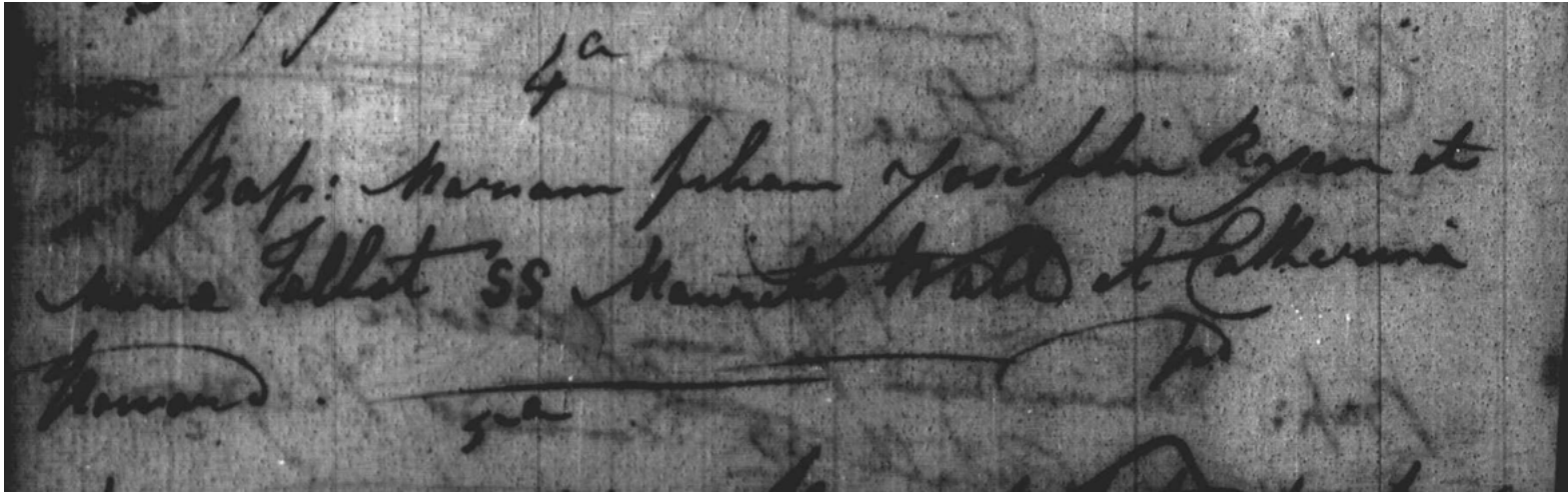

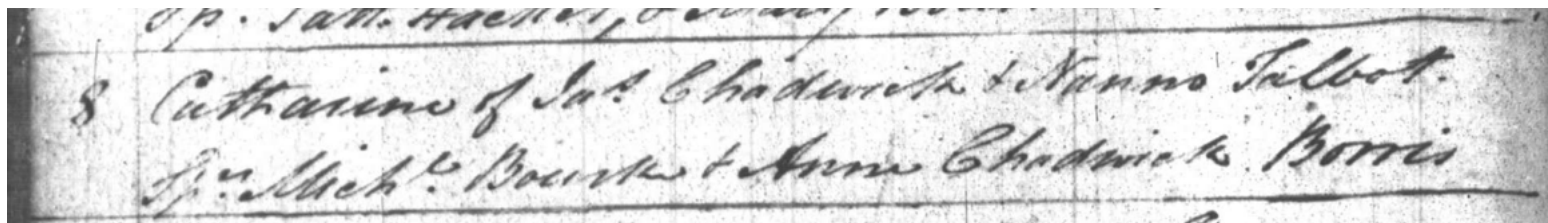

The James Talbot and Ellen Bannon Family

James Talbot married Ellen Bannon in the Ballycahill and Holly-Cross Catholic Parish of Co. Tipperary in 1859. Their children were born in Ballinlonty.

Government death records first began after the Famine of the late 1840s (usually by the 1860s). John Talbot appears to have passed away in 1834 and is buried with his daughter Catherine at Old Glenkeen Graveyard in Borrisoleigh. It is unknown why the family arranged for John's burial in this location. One explanation is that James Talbot and Catherine (Howard) Talbot are also buried at Old Glenkeen. It is also possible that the cemetery is where the Bourke family is buried.

After John Talbot's death, there is only one prominent Talbot individual in Ballinlonty - the widow Mary Talbot. There is every reason to believe that the "Widow Mary Talbot" was Mary (Bourke) Talbot, widow of John.

There is a death record from Ballinlonty in 1879 for a woman named Mary Talbot, who was a widow. The witness to her death was James Talbot, also from Ballinlonty. It is very reasonable to conclude that Thomas Talbot's brother James was the witness to the Widow Mary Talbot's death, which is highly suggestive that James (the witness) was also Mary's son.

Furthermore, James Talbot and Ellen Bannon had a relationship with Nanno Talbot, as a godmother to their children. John Talbot and Mary Bourke had a daughter with that exact same spelling, which was a very rare form of Hanora/Honoria. It is highly unlikely, given the rarity of the surname Talbot, that there would be two women named Nanno Talbot both from Ballinlonty. It is also important to note that John Talbot is presumed to have a sister Honoria, who was called Nanno. It is reasonable to conclude that since John called his daughter Nanno, it was in tribute to his sister.

The only other Talbot Marriage during that time period was Mary Talbot who married John Laffan. John Talbot and Mary Bourke had a daughter Mary. James Talbot and Ellen Bannon had a relationship with both John and Mary Laffan, as a godparents to their children.

The fact that James and Ellen Talbot had a relationship with Nanno Talbot and Mary Laffan suggests they were all siblings. James and Ellen Talbot also had a relationship with individuals of the Chadwick surname. James Talbot would have had first cousins named Chadwick through his aunt Hanora (Talbot) Chadwick.

Denis Talbot, son of James and Ellen, appears to have inherited the Talbot family farm in Ballinlonty. He was also the nephew and heir of an unmarried Nora Talbot who passed away in 1903 from Ballinlonty. It is highly plausible that Nora was Nanno Talbot, daughter of John Talbot and Mary Bourke. Nora could have been reference to Honoria/Hanora.

Mary (Talbot) Laffan

There are only two known Talbot marriages in the entire Drom Parish for those who would be the same generation as Thomas Talbot (Chicago, IL). One is Mary Talbot from Ballinlonty and the other is an unknown James Talbot who married Eliza Butler (the bride may have been from the parish, not the groom).

Mary Talbot married John Laffan in 1857 in Drom with Ballinlonty listed as the location (most likely referring to the bride's residence). The witnesses to the marriage were John Chadwick and Mary Chadwick. Hanora (Talbot) Chadwick had children with these names.

Mary Talbot and John Laffan are only known to have one child (only one has been found at this time). John Laffan was born in 1858 in the Borrisoleigh Parish.

The Chadwicks were from Borrisoleigh. All Chadwick baptisms refer to the village of Borris, which it presumed to be an abbreviation for Borrisoleigh. John Laffan was also listed as Borris for the baptism. The godparents were James Chadwick and Nanno Talbot. Mary (Talbot) Laffan is presumed to have an unmarried sister Nanno Talbot. Hanora (Talbot) Chadwick had a son James.

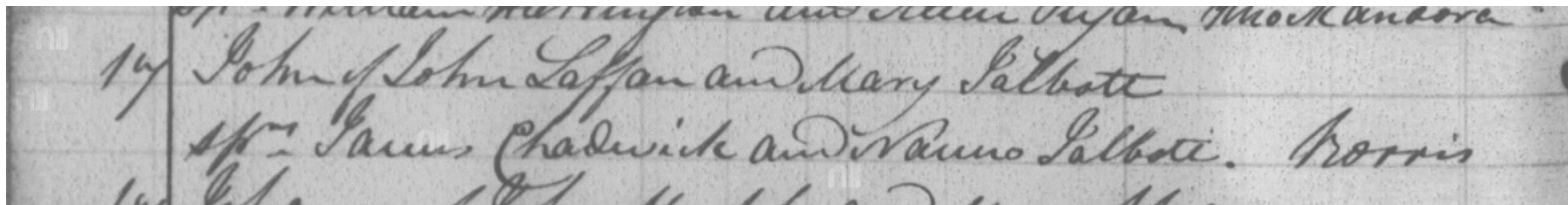
James Talbot (Delia's father and brother of Thomas) married Ellen Bannon in 1859 (Parish of Ballycahill and Holy-Cross). The witnesses to the marriage were John Laffan and John Chadwick. John Laffan is James Talbot's presumed brother-in-law. Honora (Talbot) Chadwick had a son John Chadwick. The same name was a witness to Mary (Talbot) Laffan's marriage in 1857.

James Talbot's daughter Mary was born in 1868 (Ballinlonty). The godparents were John Laffan and Mary Laffan. It is presumed that Mary Laffan is James's sister and John Laffan is her husband.

John Talbot and Mary Bourke had a daughter Nanno Talbot. Nanno is a variant of Hanora/Honoria.

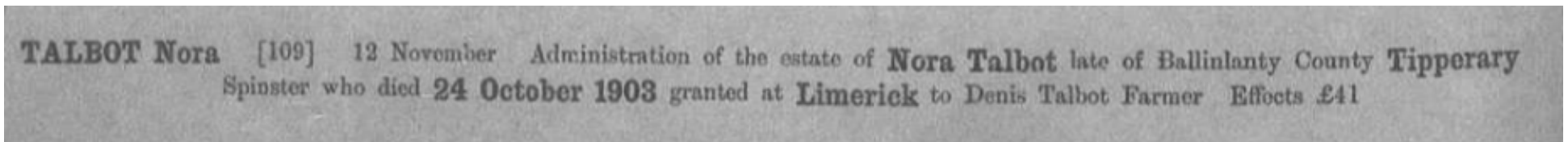
Nanno Talbot was a godmother for Mary (Talbot) Laffan's son and James Talbot's first child (John) born in 1860 (Ballinlonty).

Denis Talbot from Ballinlonty was the next-of-kin and nephew to an unmarried Nora Talbot who died in Ballinlonty in 1903. Nanno Talbot would be Denis Talbot's aunt.

If his mother was approximately 25 years old when John Talbot was born around 1794, she would have been born about 1769. If her father Pierce Howard was also about 25 when she was born, his estimated birth year would be about 1744

Therefore, the priest Thomas Howard was about the same age as Pierce Howard.

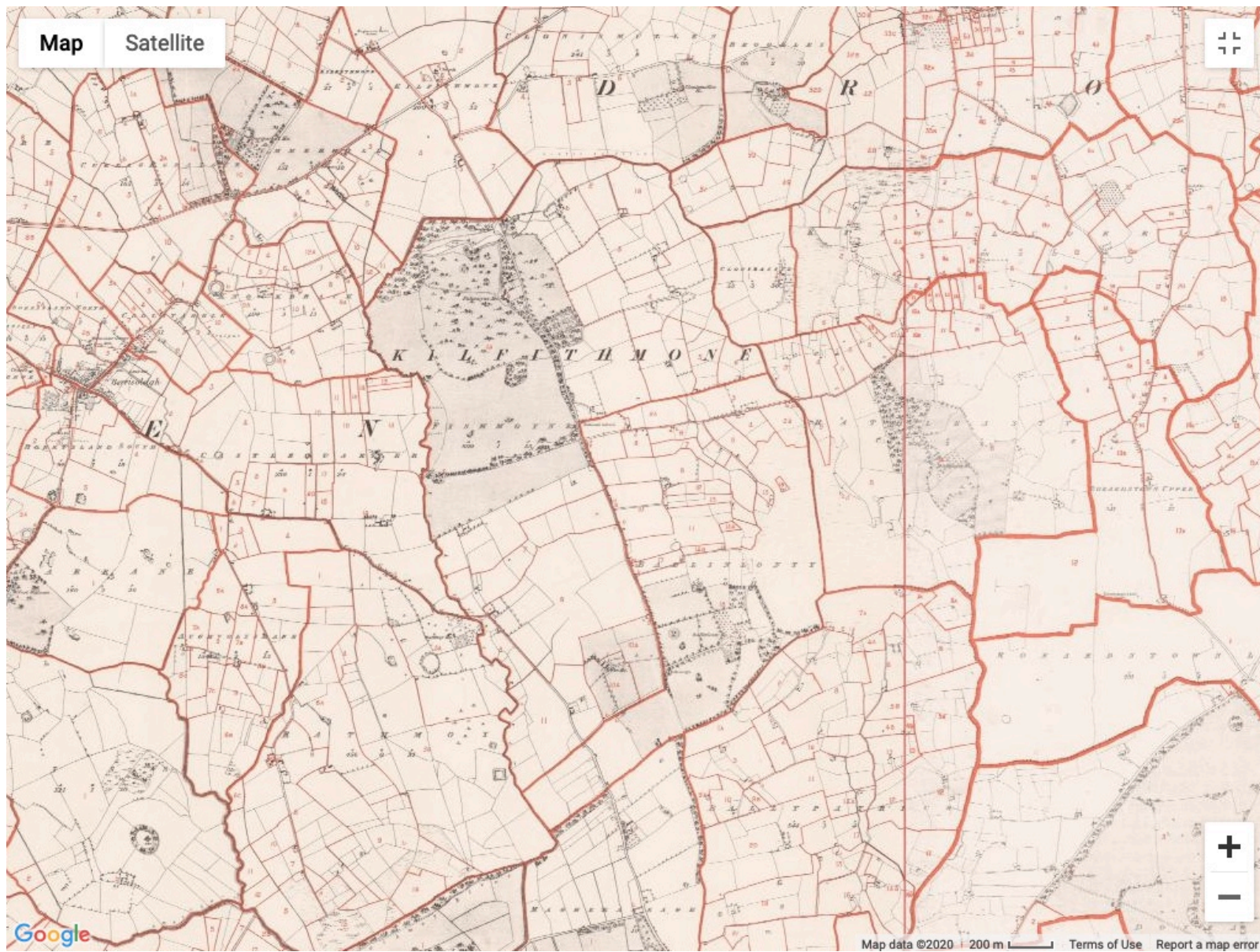

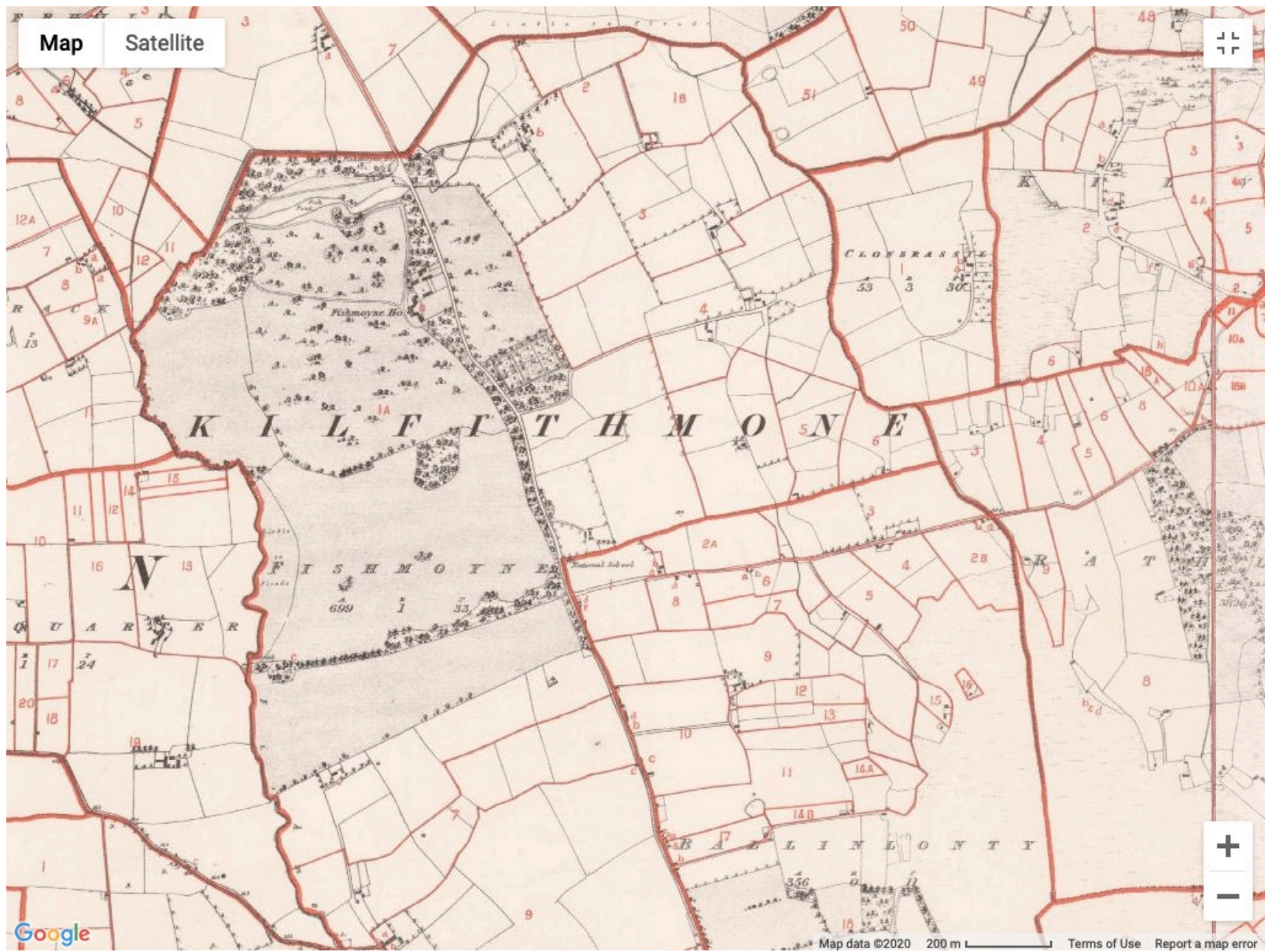

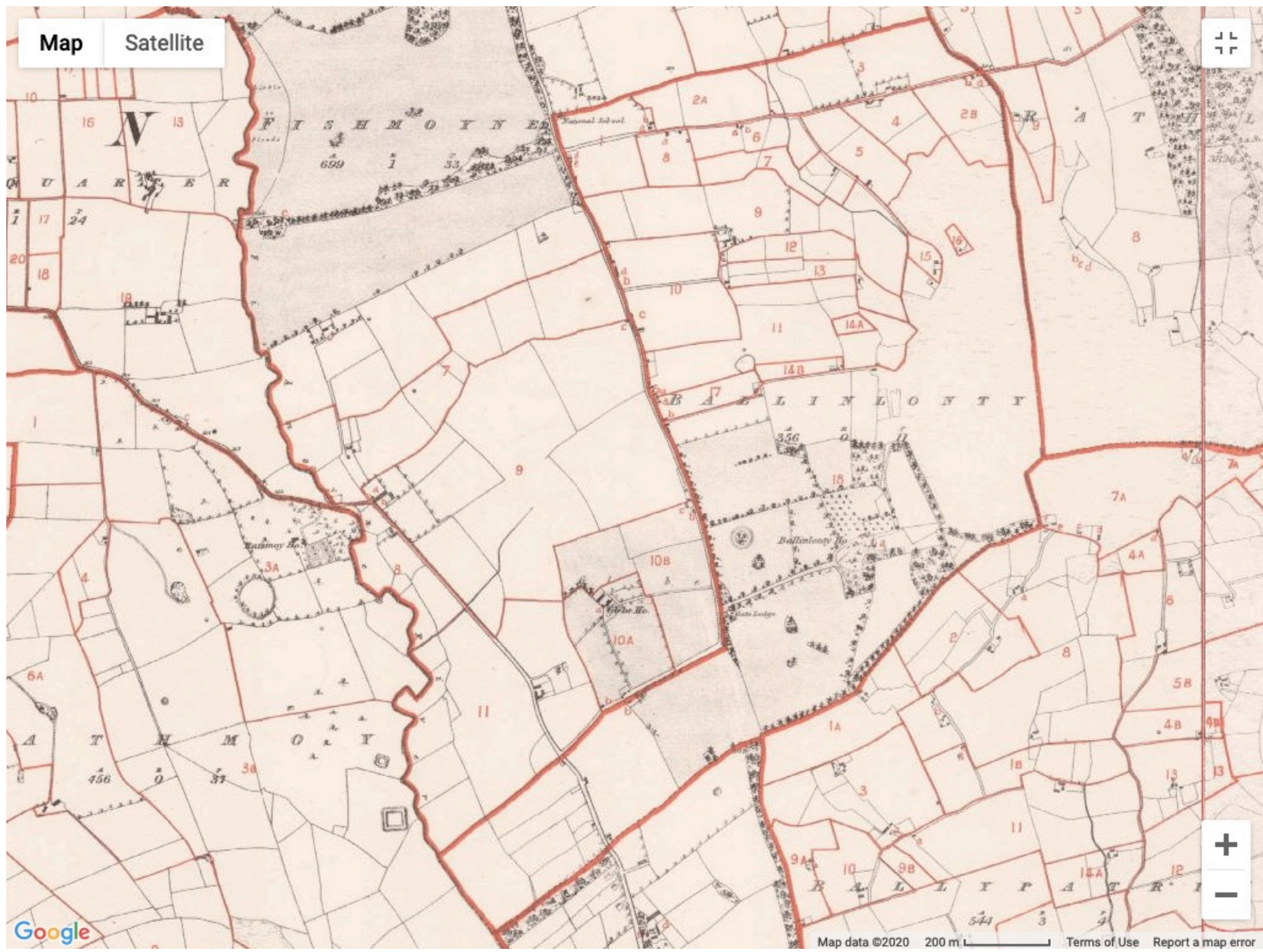

MYSTERIOUS PROCEEDINGS.

The following is an extract of a letter from Thurles, detailing the demolition of a gallery in the Catholic Chapel at Drom, near Templemore, on Wednesday last. The leader in this disgraceful transaction is said to be partly insane. The communication is authenticated by the signature

of a respectable Subscriber in that neighbourhood:—

“An outrage of the most daring kind was committed in the Parish Chapel of Drom, within three miles of Templemore and six of Thurles, on Wednesday last. A party of men, led on by a person whose duty it was to have instructed the ignorant, instead of stimulating them to a violation of the law, proceeded to the Chapel in a tumultuous manner, and with hatchets, iron crow-bars, &c., cut down and demolished a large gallery, which was erected upwards of thirty years ago at the sole expense of a respectable family in the parish, who, to the time of the destruction, used it. No cause was assigned for this flagrant act, but that it was the will and pleasure of the *leader*. The venerable Parish

pleasure of the *leader*. The venerable Parish Priest, the Rev. Thomas Howard, on hearing of the outrage, repaired to the Chapel, but arrived too late—the destruction being completed, and the materials of the gallery cast into the high way, before he reached there. This respectable Gentleman, we understand, is excused from active duty by reason of his age and long and exemplary services—but is allowed the assistance of two Curates to perform the arduous duties of the United Parishes of Drom and Inch, of which he has been Parish Priest for upwards of thirty years past. We are informed a prosecution has been commenced against the party concerned in this transaction; and that the conduct of a person said to be engaged as a principal in the affair, will be laid before the Roman Catholic Archbishop, Dr. Laffan, on his return to Thurles, whence he is absent at present on a Visitation. Under these circumstances, we abstain from disclosing farther particulars; but we hope to be able very shortly to submit to our readers the result of the investigation into this mysterious, sacrilegious, and wanton outrage.”

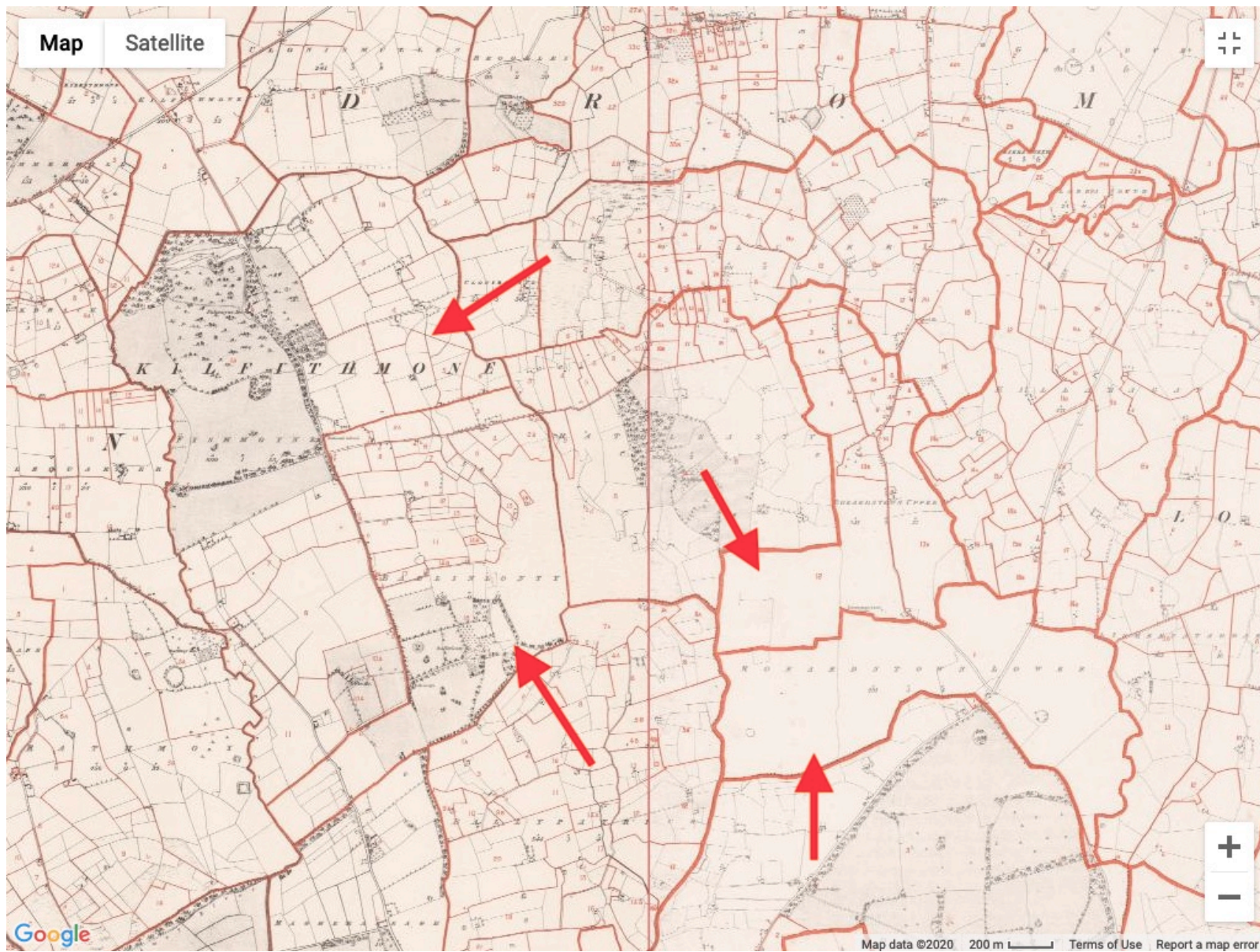

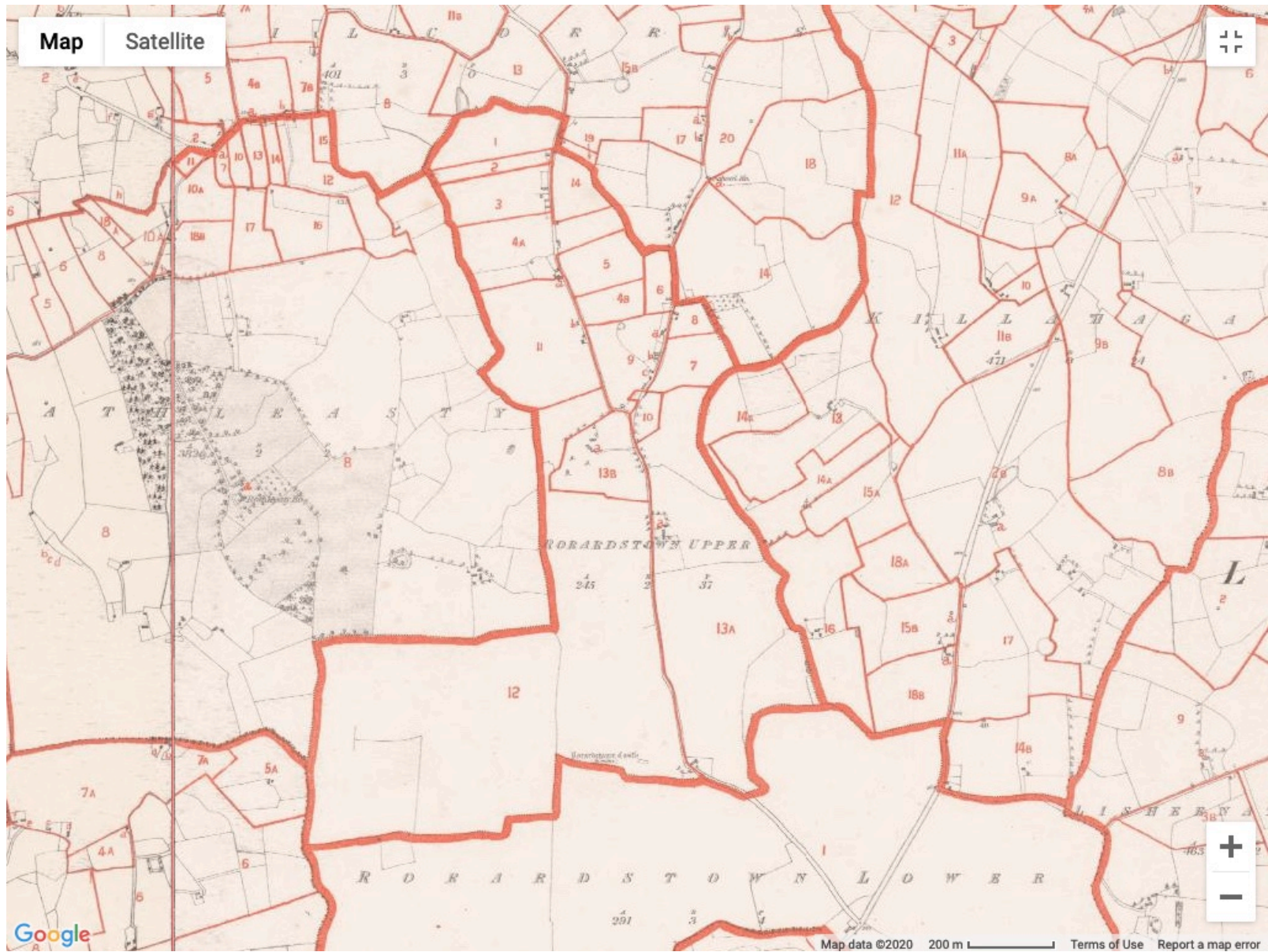

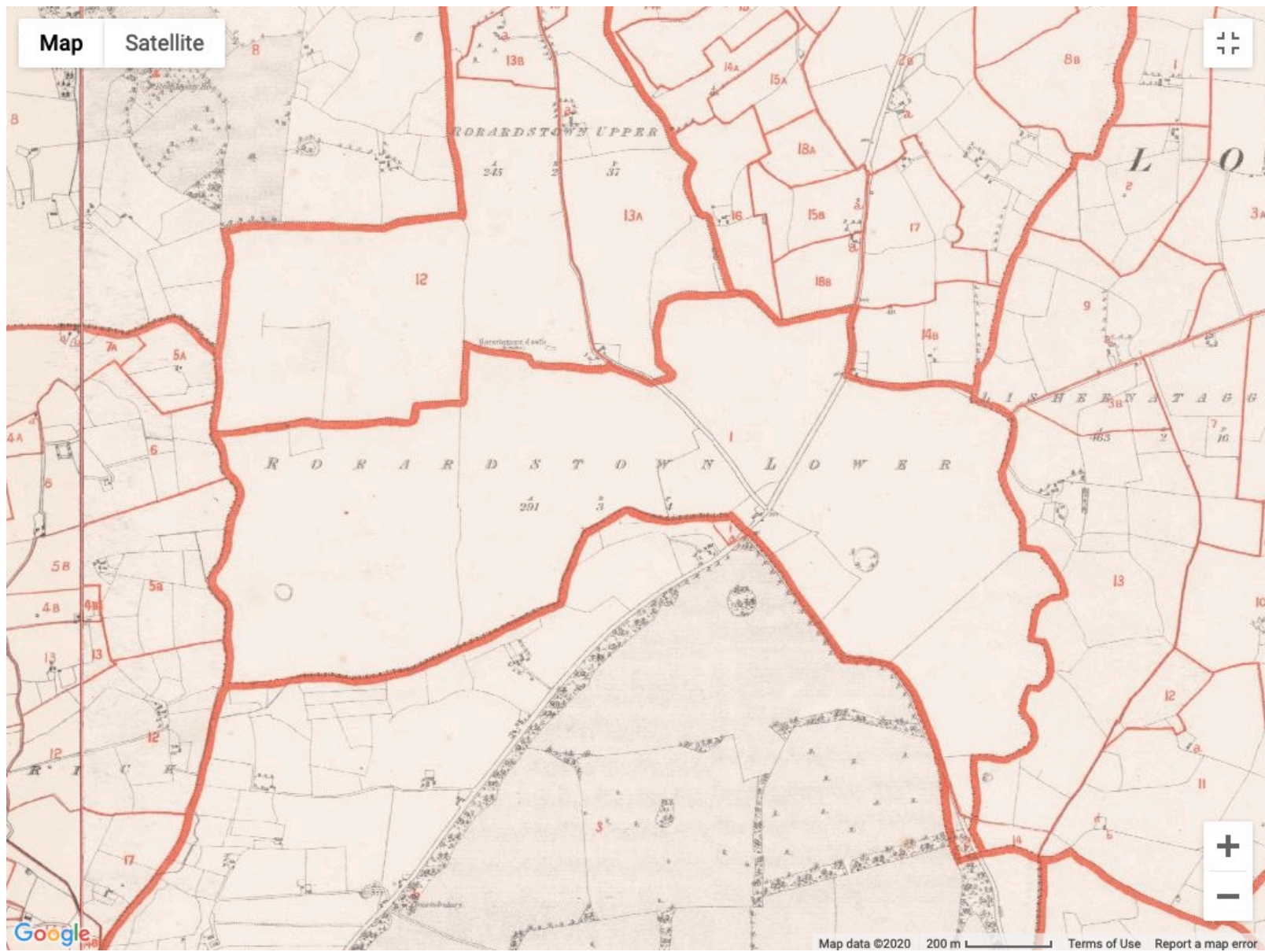


Map that is presumed to be the location of Rordstown (probably misspelled)

Observations

Mr. Fletcher from Clonmore was executor of Pierce Howard's estate in Fishmoyne. It would appear that it was William Fletcher, whose wife was Bridget Howard. It further appears that Bridget was a widow when she married William Fletcher and that her first husband was George Meara.

Since Bridget married George Meara in 1823, she could have been born around 1800. This implies that she was the same generation as the Talbot siblings (John, Mary, and Honoria). Therefore, Pierce Howard could have been Bridget's uncle.

Conclusion

Michael E. Byczek, after extensive historical research, on balance of probabilities, has made the following observations that are highly plausible and more likely than not to reflect accurate Talbot genealogy:

1. Thomas Talbot was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke from Ballinlonty, Co Tipperary.
2. John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard, also from Ballinlonty.
3. Catherine (Howard) Talbot was the daughter of Pierce Howard
4. James Talbot and Catherine Howard raised their family in Ballinlonty within the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish where the Howard family held a prominent status.
5. The family appears to have lived in the manor house of Ballinlonty, at least during the 1810s, which was called "Ballinlonty House".
6. The Talbot family was not originally from the Drom and Inch Catholic Parish, which explains the significance of why the only known Talbot individuals are linked together as if a single multi-generational versus extended family.
7. The John Talbot family of Ballinlonty and Pierce Howard family of Fishmoyne had a close genealogical relationship.
8. The priest Thomas Howard of Drom and Inch appears to have been a close relative of Pierce Howard, and therefore, the Talbot family.

Next Steps

The following documents, if found, should provide more information about the lineage of Michael E. Byczek:

1. Pierce Howard's probate case in 1837, such as a Will or other court documents with reference to his family.
2. Nora Talbot's probate case from 1903, such as a Will that expressly identified herself as the daughter of John Talbot and Mary Bourke and/or sister of Thomas Talbot from Chicago.
3. Actual land records for the Talbot farm in Ballinlonty and Howard farm in Fishmoyne to determine the exact chronology of transfer between different generations of the family.
4. Diocese records that may explain more biographical information about the priest Thomas Howard.
5. Student records for the priest Thomas Howard from Louvain/Leuven in Belgium that may describe his family.
6. Diocese journal entries that may refer to interaction with the Talbot and Howard families.
7. Howard families from Golden to cross-reference with the priest Thomas Howard.
8. Where the marriage of James Talbot and Catherine Howard took place.
9. Pierce Howard is a very rare name. Any documents that link such a name to County Tipperary is highly likely to be the correct individual.

Michael E. Byczek has determined, through DNA genealogy, that he is a blood relative of another prominent Talbot family in Co. Tipperary. He is currently researching this other family to determine the most likely relationship to either John Talbot (wife Mary Bourke) or James Talbot (wife Catherine Howard). DNA results also show several cross-references to Bourke families in Co. Tipperary.

The Talbot Folklore of Ballinlonty, Co. Tipperary in Ireland

The Talbot lineage in Co. Tipperary, while not verified, is the subject of folklore. There is a possibility that Thomas Talbot, and therefore his 3x-great-grandson Michael E. Byczek, are the direct blood descendants of international royal and noble bloodlines. This could include crowned Kings and Queens of England, Wales, Scotland, Ireland, France, and Spain along with Holy Roman and Byzantium Emperors in addition to other high ranking titles of nobility throughout Europe. One claim is that a son of Queen Victoria of England had personal knowledge of the family connection to the Talbot lineage in Ballinlonty.

Michael E. Byczek, as an attorney, advocates the highest standards of ethical historical research and moral-based genealogy. Whether or not Thomas Talbot is a descendant of the greatest houses of nobility has not been verified. Michael E. Byczek cannot, and will not, make a definitive conclusion at this time. He affectionately refers to this research project as the “Talbot Folklore”.

On balance of probabilities, it is highly plausible and more likely than not to be true, that:

1. Thomas Talbot was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke from Ballinlonty.
2. John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard, who lived in Ballinlonty.
3. Catherine (Howard) Talbot was the daughter of Pierce Howard
4. John Talbot had two sisters Mary (Talbot) Ryan and Hannah (Talbot) Chadwick

The “Talbot Folklore” suggests that James Talbot (Michael E. Byczek’s presumptive 5x-great-grandfather) was the direct blood descendant of John Talbot, the first Earl of Shrewsbury who was immortalized by William Shakespeare. Furthermore, that Catherine (Howard) Talbot (Michael E. Byczek’s presumptive 5x-great-grandmother) was “kin” to the Duke of Norfolk.

An important clue is the alleged connection to the 11th Duke of Norfolk. It has been mentioned that the 11th Duke was interested in genealogy and the history of the Howard family. This could be the reason why the Talbot family in Ballinlonty took pride in their relationship to that particular Duke.

A very similar folklore originates from nearby Templemore in Co. Tipperary where Talbot and Howard families intermarried with an alleged connection to Irish and English nobility, including Malahide Castle in Dublin.

Michael E. Byczek took a DNA test in the autumn of 2024 not for genealogy, but to intervene as an attorney to stop the spread of false claims across his entire family tree. DNA results showed a genetic relationship to a prominent Talbot family in Co. Tipperary and numerous cross-references to both Talbot and Howard nobility in England. There was a noticeable pattern of possible connections to Talbot and Howard families in Colonial America. However, the results were inconclusive as to the exact degree of kinship, if any, between users or any precise common nobility ancestry.

As an attorney, Michael E. Byczek fully understands the caution that is necessary to make absolute conclusions about genealogy. He does not claim to be a blood descendant of any royal or noble bloodline. Nor does he claim that the “Talbot Folklore” itself is true. Furthermore, he does not claim with absolute certainty, only balance of probabilities, that he is the 5x-great-grandson of James Talbot and Catherine Howard who may or may not have been members of the English nobility.

It is Michael E. Byczek’s intention, that if the “Talbot Folklore” is proven true, to fully restore his 3x-great-grandfather Thomas Talbot to each verified royal and nobility bloodline pedigree throughout the world of which he is a direct blood descendant.

A comprehensive documentary detailing the current state of research into the “Talbot Folklore” is under development.

Additional Information

Michael E. Byczek, an Illinois attorney and managing real estate broker, has compiled original records for genealogy since 1992. Research and analysis have been published on family websites for over 30 years. A project to compile comprehensive digital, print, and video documentaries for every direct blood ancestor began in September 2024 for accurate online genealogy.

Thomas Talbot and Hannah McDonald are Michael E. Byczek's 3x-great-grandparents. Their eldest child, a son, Edward H. Talbot (2x-great-grandfather) married Kittie A. Rooney in Chicago at Holy Name Cathedral in 1880. Their only daughter Marie T. Talbot (great-grandmother) married Martin J. Flanagan, also at Holy Name Cathedral, in 1922. Their eldest child, a daughter, Marie C. Flanagan (grandmother) married Michael S. Byczek at St. Bridget's in the Bridgeport neighborhood in 1950. Their eldest child, a son, Michael M. Byczek (father) married Betty A. Bykowski in 1974 at St. Helen's on Augusta and Oakley in Chicago. They have two children. Michael E. Byczek is the eldest and was born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.

On balance of probabilities, Thomas Talbot was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke (4x-great-grandparents). Furthermore, records support the conclusion that John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard (5x-great-grandparents) and that she was the daughter of Pierce Howard (6x-great-grandfather).

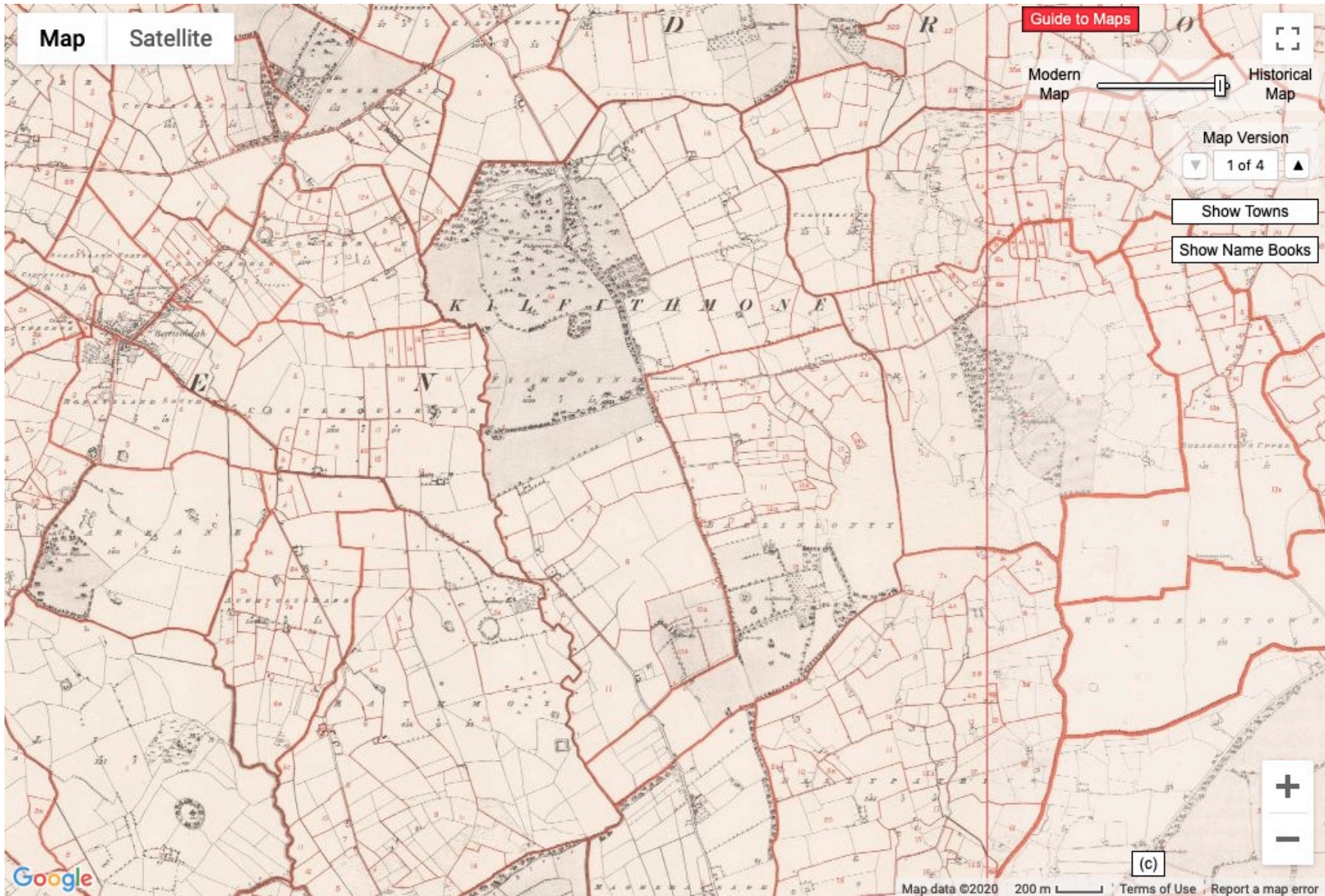

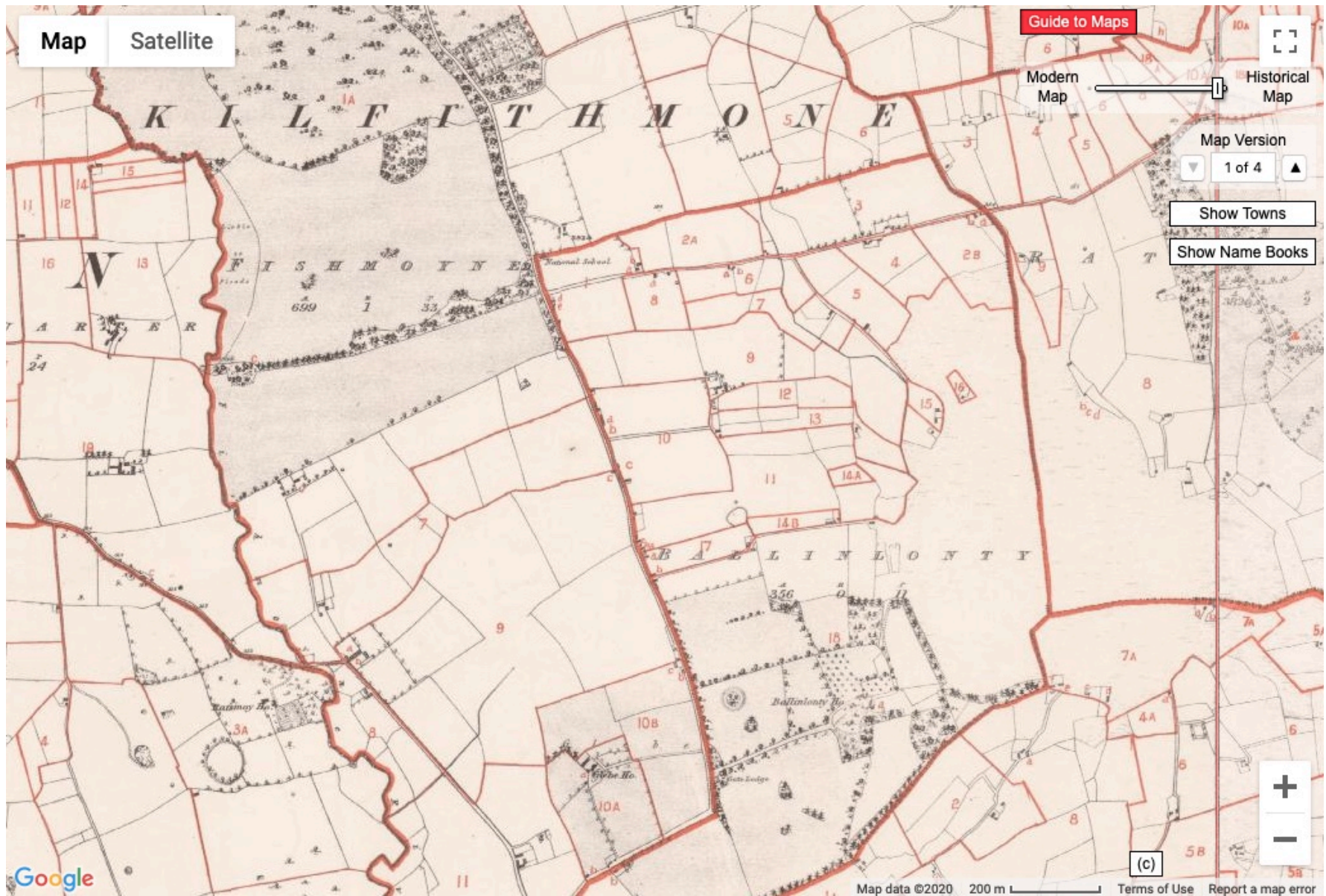

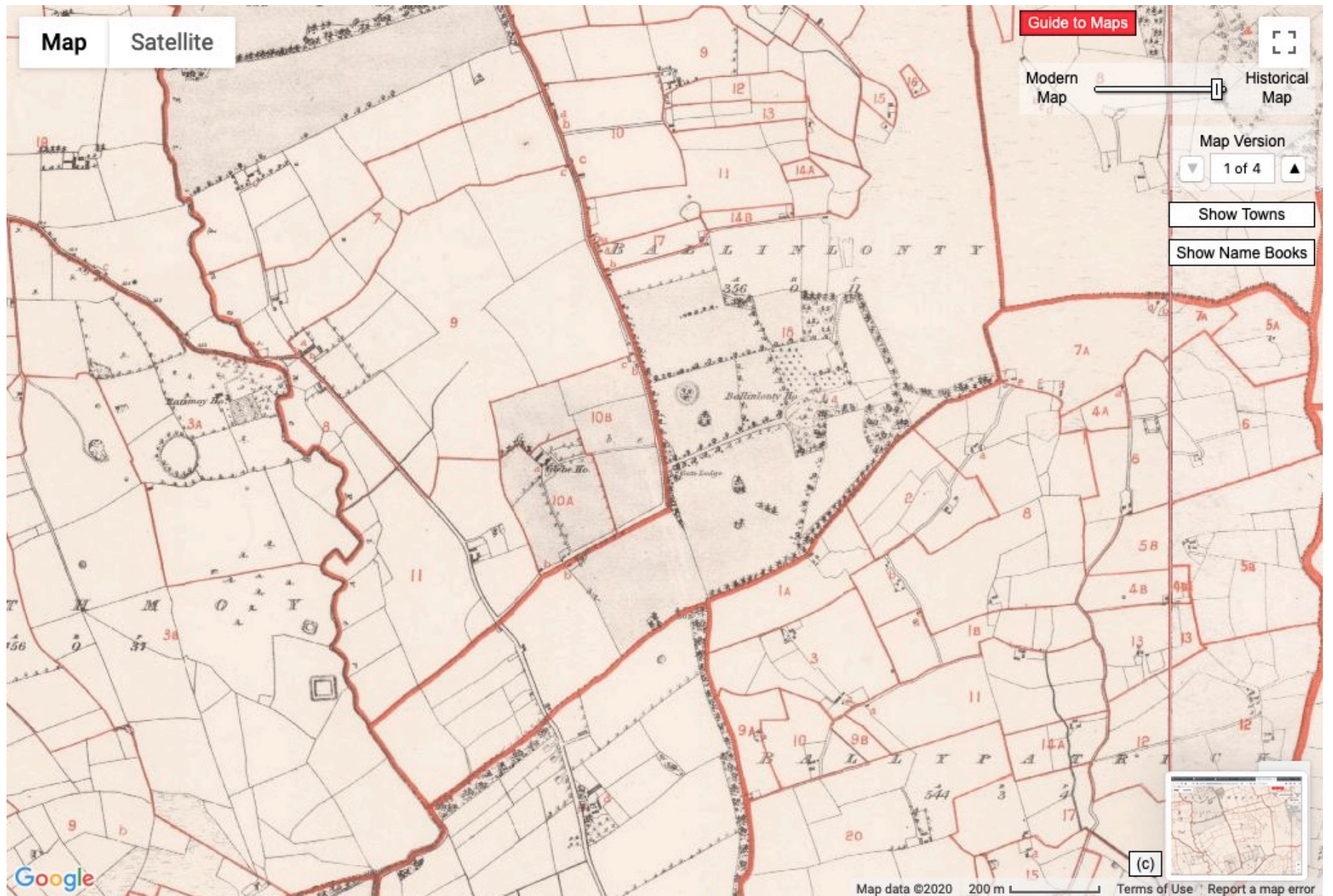

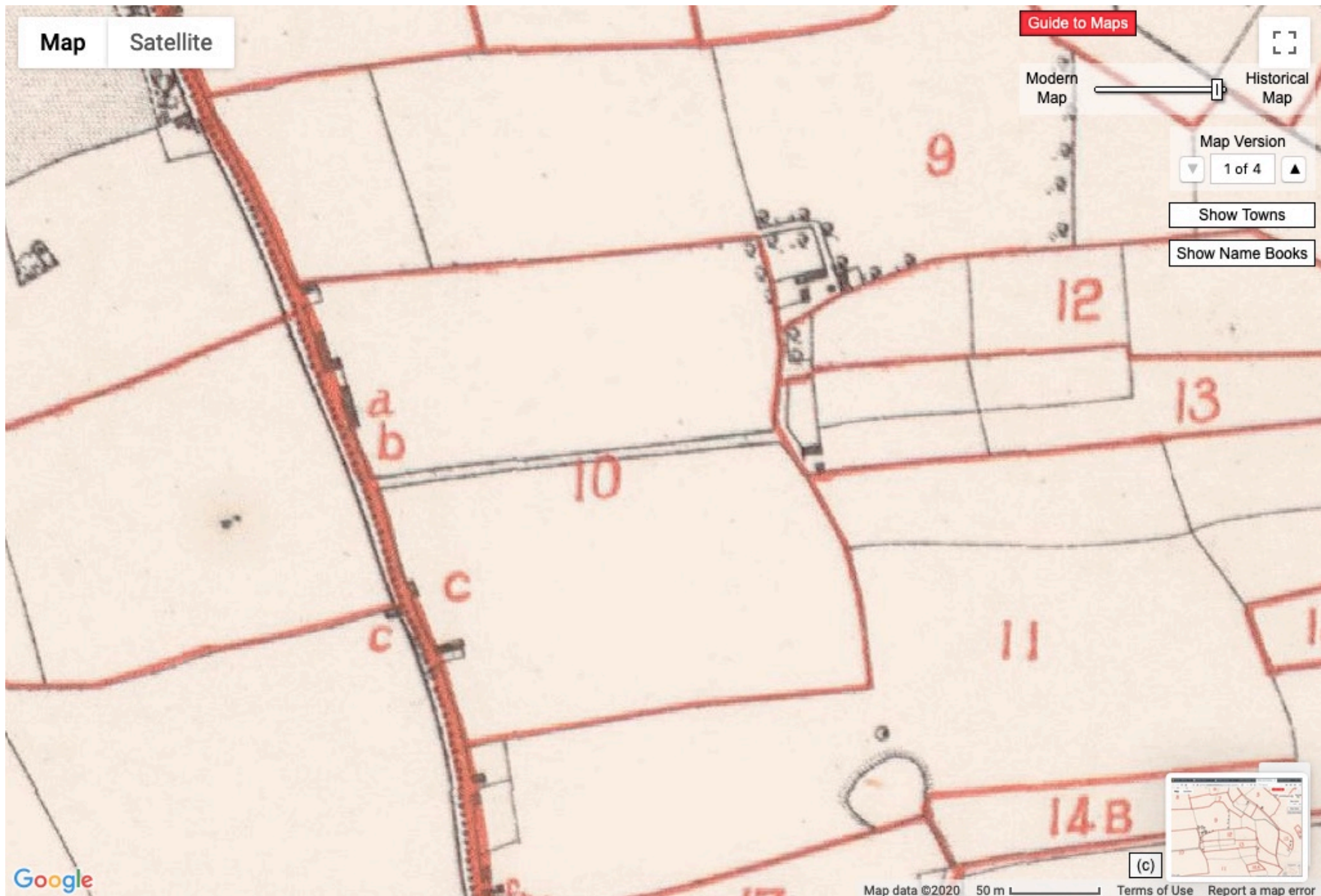
Map of all Kilfithmone

South half of Ballinlonty

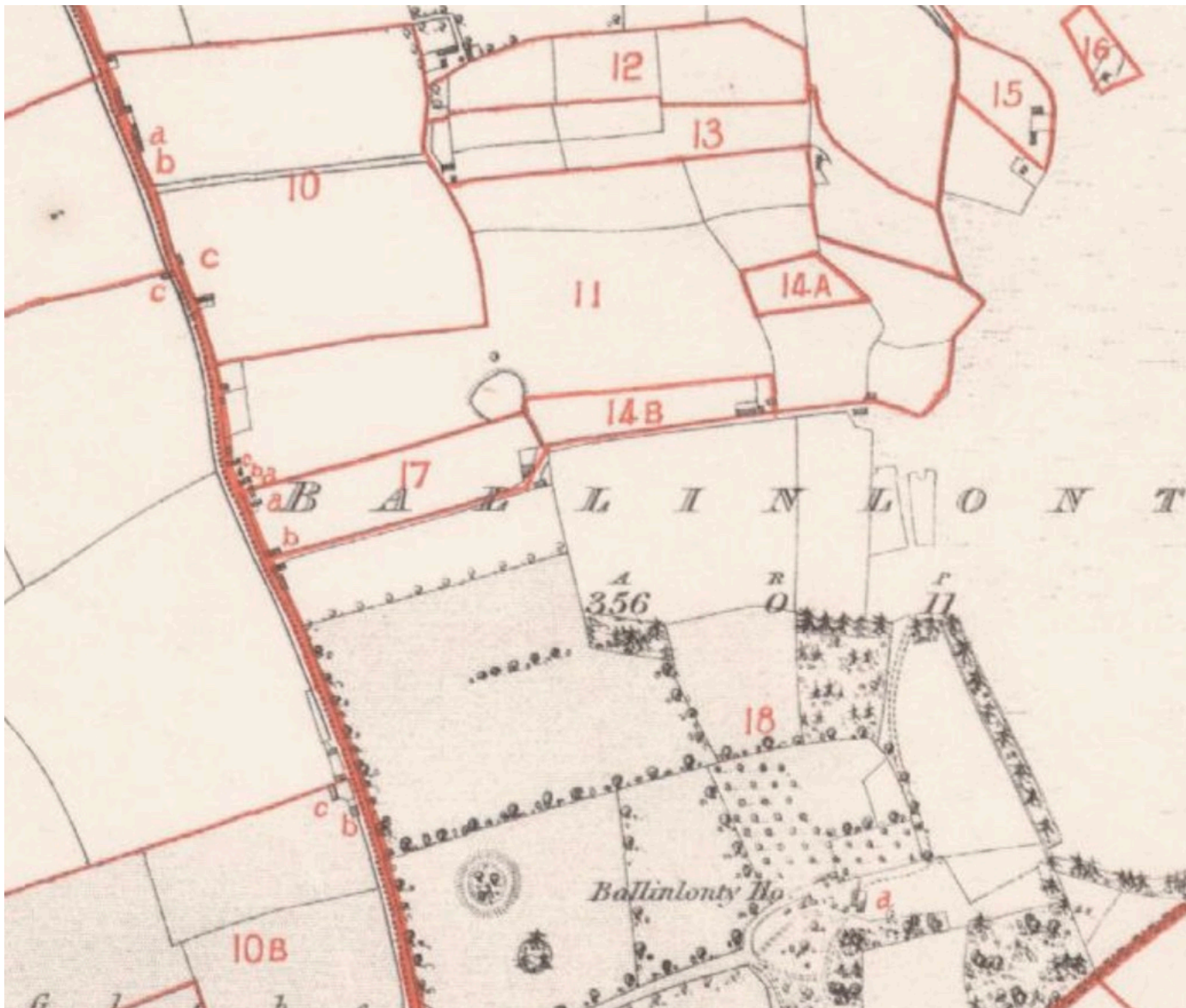

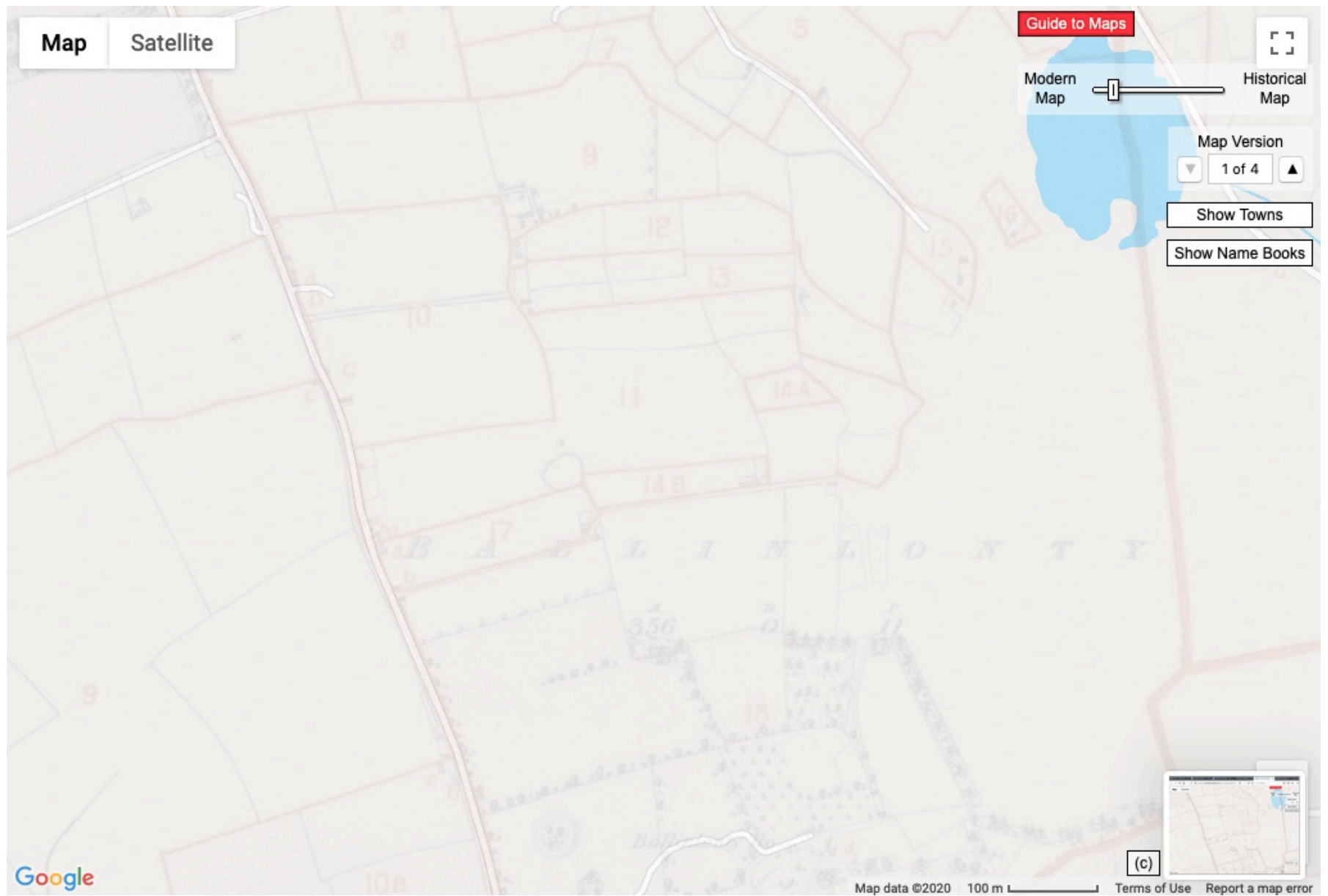

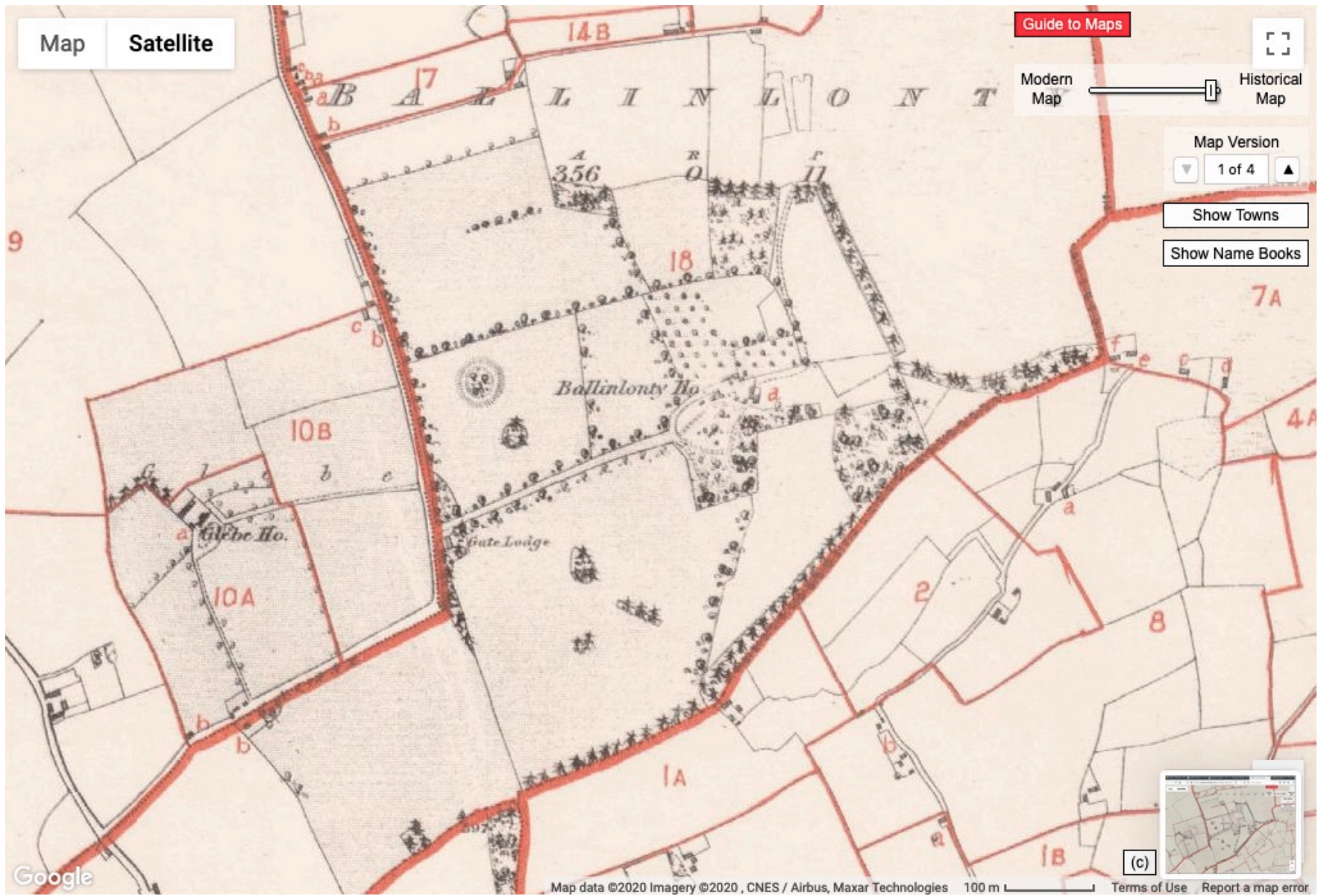

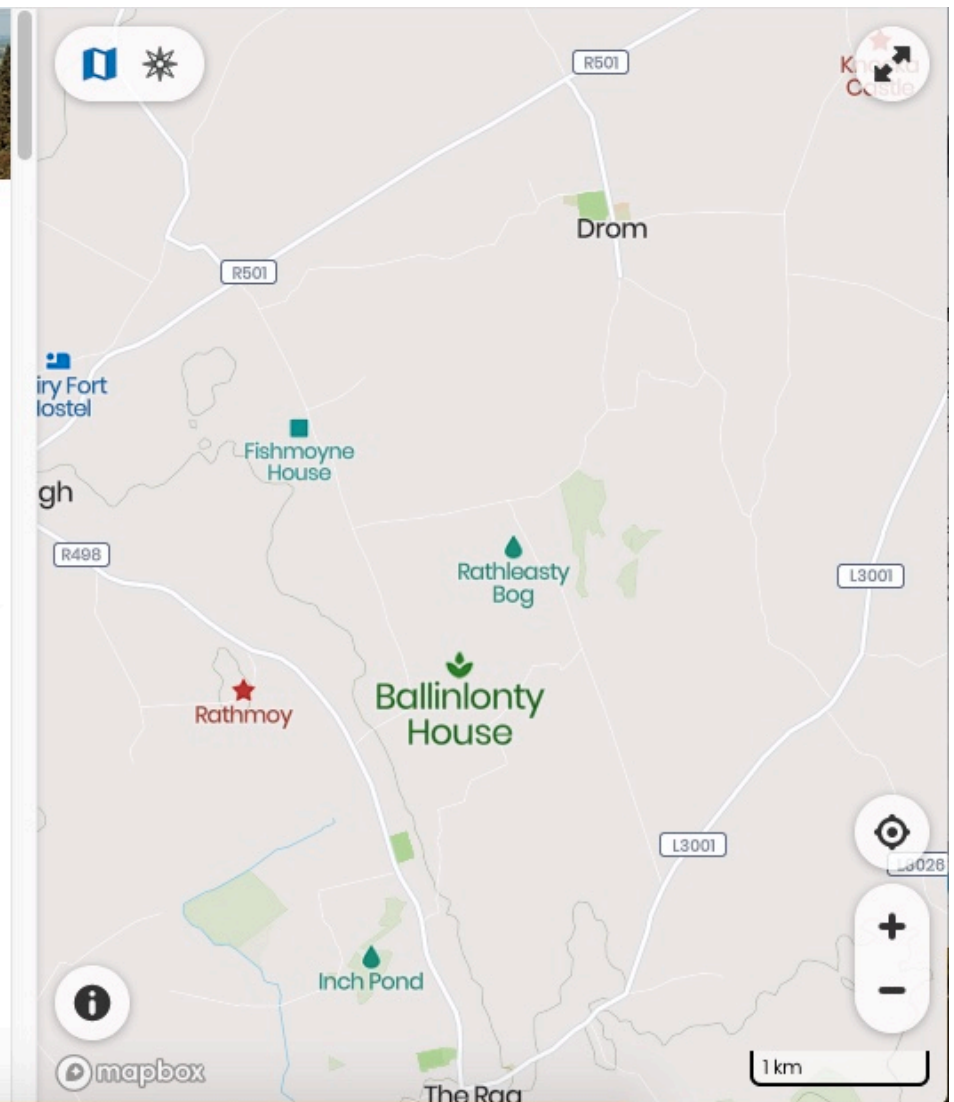

Byczek is the eldest and was born in the Bridgeport neighborhood.

On balance of probabilities, Thomas Talbot was the son of John Talbot and Mary Bourke (4x-great-grandparents). Furthermore, records support the conclusion that John Talbot was the son of James Talbot and Catherine Howard (5x-great-grandparents) and that she was the daughter of Pierce Howard (6x-great-grandfather).
